

SHORTAGE OF FEES IN INTERIOR FORCES CATTLE SALES

CHICKEN TRADES WEAKER WITH LOWER PRICES IN EFFECT

Trade is Overful With Supplies and Leading Retailers Forced to Withdraw From Market—Ducks Come More Freely and Sell.

Weakness in the chicken trade here at the moment is due to the greatly increased offerings of the general contractor of supplies. Not only are holdings in the hands of the wholesale trade very liberal, but practically all of the big retail buyers have a surplus on hand and for that reason are removed from the immediate market.

OREGON OKAYS ARE HIGHED WITH OTHERS SHOWING A DECLINE

Southern Oregon Stock So Good That It is Selling Up to \$2.25 Grade—Junk From South Hurting General Trade—Dealers Suffering Losses.

While there is a weaker tone and lower prices for California crops, a low market for the Oregon stock is so good that values on Tokays have been advanced 20c, and instead of showing a decline, the best select Tokays from the Jacksonville section are being made at \$2.25 per crate with the demand being for "junk," it being sold at values somewhat below the actual cost of handling here.

Chicago, Oct. 5.—(I. N. S.)—The grain market opened with a strong upturn. The market being generally higher for corn, wheat and soybeans.

SWEEP POTATO MARKET BROKEN
