Women Take Over All Fraternity and Club Houses at O. A. C. During War.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Oct. 11.—Following the conversion of eight of the former fraternity houses and eight of the sorority houses into halls of residence for the accommodation of the large number of coeds who have registered here this fall, Mrs. Mary K. Shooting of Young Boy Held Accident By Coroner's Jury

Carelessness, rather than intent on the part of Jack Brown, aged 14 years, caused the death of George Kuhlman, aged 12, according to the verdict of a coroner's jury Wednesday night. The Kuhlman boy was shot by young Brown with a shotgun last Saturday evening near Rockwood, dying Monday morning. Deputy District Attorney Hammsley testified that George Kuhlman told him before he died that Brown had pointed the gun at him and pulled the trigger. Frank Kuhlman, a younger brother present at the time of the shooting, told a similar story. The Brown boy denied this and said he was carrying the gun over his shoulder, when it went off accidentally. The boy's grandfather declared the shot was purely accidental, the lads having been playing together until time for Brown to look after the family cow, when he started away with the gun over his shoulder.
