

SOCIALISTS NOW RULE IN AUSTRIA

BIG EVENTS IN SHAPING AT COUNCIL OF ALLIES

Armistice Terms Expected to Demand Surrender by Germany and Austria; Turkey's Collapse Helps to Hasten End.

Hapsburg Dynasty Believed to Have Fallen and Kaiser's Position Gets More Precarious Daily; Outlook Is Bright.

PARIS, Nov. 1. (U. P.)—(11:25 A. M.)—Action equivalent to the surrender of the German and Austrian high military commands, it is believed certain today, will be included in the armistice terms.

Reactionaries in Senate Ready to Assume Control

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—(Washington Bureau of The Journal.)—Who are the Republican leaders in congress to whom the president must look for support if the country fails to sustain him next Tuesday?

The senate is most easily analyzed, because it is the smaller body and most effectually controlled through committee seniority and caucus action.

Six senators known to the country as reactionary captains hold dominating sway on the Republican membership of the six most powerful committees.

These committees are: Finance, which acts on revenue; foreign relations, which acts on treaties; appropriations, where the big supply bills are made up; military affairs and naval affairs, which deal with the country's military and naval program, and the committee on rules which holds a tight hand on the consideration of business.

WILSON'S FOES LYING IN WAIT Backing up the reactionary Republican leaders and ranking just below them in places of influence are Woodworth, Weeks, Fall, Knox, Poinsett and others whose names suggest what attitude they will take if opportunities come for them to discredit and harass the president.

Much the same conditions exist in the house, where the leaders are just as alert and eager, but their names are not so readily appreciated as agents of reaction because events have brought them less under national observation.

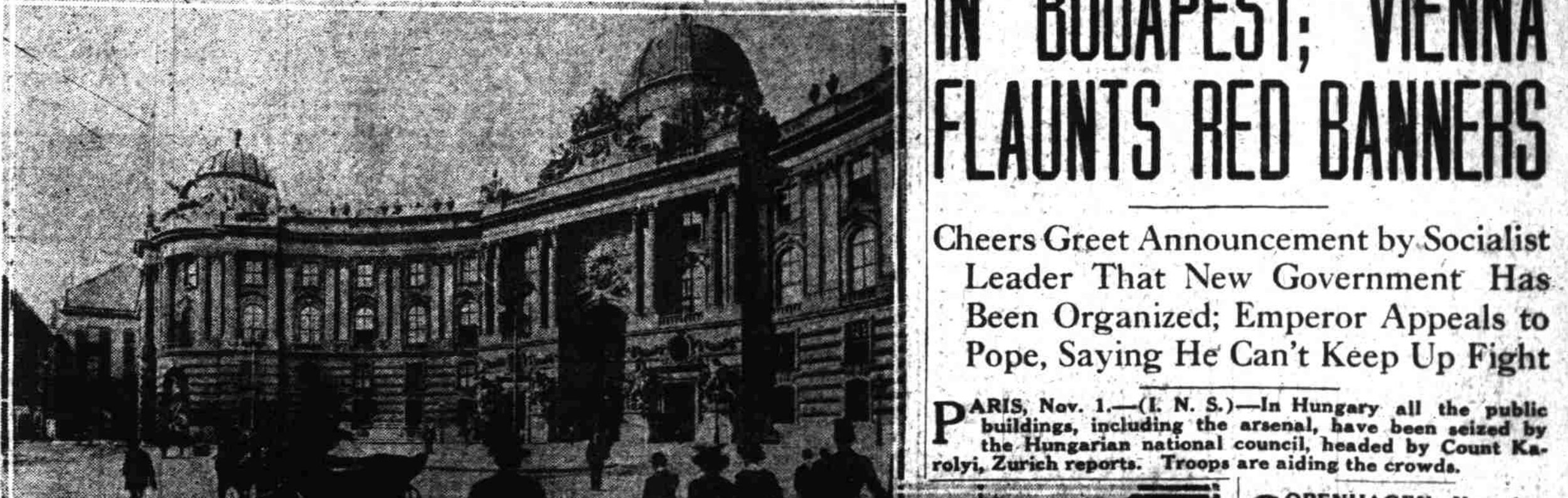

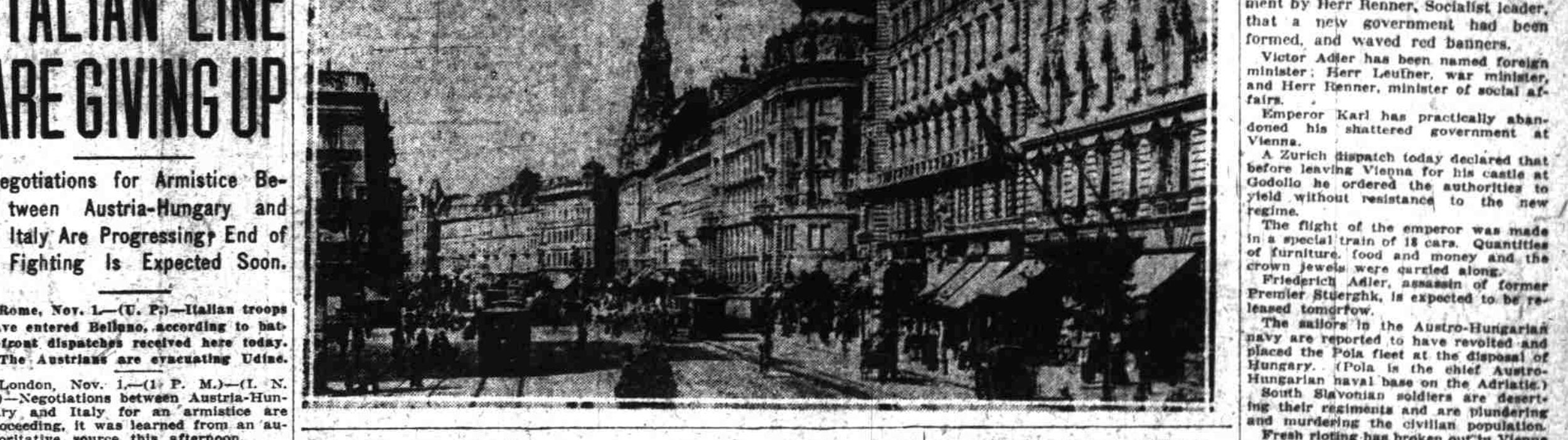
Emperor Karl Flees From Vienna; Greatest Defeat in War Develops

MOBS SPREAD TERROR IN BUDAPEST; VIENNA FLAUNTS RED BANNERS

Cheers Greet Announcement by Socialist Leader That New Government Has Been Organized; Emperor Appeals to Pope, Saying He Can't Keep Up Fight

PARIS, Nov. 1.—(I. N. S.)—In Hungary all the public buildings, including the arsenal, have been seized by the Hungarian national council, headed by Count Karolyi, Zurich reports. Troops are aiding the crowds.

COPENHAGEN, Nov. 1.—A new national government, with Socialists in charge, has risen in Austria.

Emperor Karl has fled from Vienna to his castle at Godollo, 15 miles from Budapest. Widespread anarchy is threatened throughout the dual empire, with mobs rioting in Vienna and Budapest.

Count Tisza dies, slain by soldier. Former Hungarian Premier, Credited With Note Starting War, Assassinated.

Count Tisza is credited with having written the dictatorial note to Serbia on the murder of the Austrian archduke, which started the war.

Women Composure Wounded. Borneo, Nov. 1.—(U. P.)—Count Tisza, former Hungarian premier and leader of the Hungarian government party, has been murdered, according to a dispatch from Vienna today.
