

APPEAL TO MAKE PORTLAND A REAL PORT IS ISSUED

Payrolls and Commerce Go Hand in Hand, States Chamber of Commerce in Urging Issue.

GREAT DEVELOPMENT DUE

Voting of Harbor Improvement Bonds Would Protect Huge Expenditures Already Made.

"Make Portland a port for Portland made ships" is the appeal of the Portland Chamber of Commerce for support of the proposed \$5,000,000 dock bond issue upon which voters will pass next Tuesday.

"Portland can get vast government tonnage if Portland will provide adequate shipping facilities." The expressions appear in a special edition of Portland Commerce, official organ of the Chamber of Commerce, which will be distributed widely among business men.

A brief general argument summarizes the advantage of port facilities in this way: "Seaboard cities attract commerce and business. In order to have this commerce and business there must

be port facilities, and the great development is by the cheapest and most elastic water. That is what has contributed to the development of such cities as Montreal, Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, New Orleans, San Francisco, Seattle, Hamburg, Antwerp, Liverpool and London."

The bond issue is described as "Portland's chance."

"Take the first step needed in the consummation of a great port development plan," the Chamber of Commerce urges.

"The following work must be done in Portland to get ready for the big business."

ness that will come under peace conditions:
"Modern wharves and warehouses."
"Lumber transshipping wharves."
"A deeper and more commodious harbor."
"A deeper, wider and better marked channel from Portland to the sea."
"A modern drydock of 15,000 tons capacity."
"Pilotage service at the mouth of the

river guaranteeing against delays.
"Coal bunkers and stream loading facilities."
"Ship repair shops."
"All of this work must be done by the public or private interests. If private capital does not do it, the public must. Vota bonds to start the work and make Portland a real seaport."
It is suggested that not only should each member of the Chamber of Com-

merce vote for the bonds, but that he should get 10 of his friends to do likewise.
Portland is urged to protect the investment of many millions already made by the government and the Port of Portland in channel and harbor improvement. A table shows that only one other port, Philadelphia, has been the beneficiary of a larger expenditure
