PRUNE AND SLASH MUST BE SLOGAN OF LEGISLATURE

State's Solons Will Have to Figure How to Make \$7,870,580 Do Work of \$9,167,795.

GROSS REVENUE \$14,551,649

Of Total Income \$5,383,854 Represents Contributions Paid Into Industrial Accident Fund.

Salem, Or., Dec. 25 .- When the legislature meets next month it will have more use for a pruning knife than any other instrument. Some very generous pruning will be required if the biennial appropriations are to be kept within the limits of the money available to meet them. But it is predicted that the legislature cannot provide for the needs of the state government and hold its appropriations within the funds in sight for the next

The biennial budget, compiled by Secretary of State Olcott from estimates submitted to him by the heads of various departments and branches of the state government and state activities, shows a total of \$14,551,649.92, but \$5,383,854.11 can be eliminated without further consideration, as it represents contributions paid into the state industrial accident fund, fees to be applied to specific purposes, and receipts not paid into the state treasury. Has Its Work Cut Out

This leaves \$9,167,795.81 for the legislature to worry over. Included in this sum is \$901,100, representing continuing appropriations now in effect, and \$1,947,-651.78, representing millage tax levies for the O. A. C., U. of O., Monrouth Normal, roads and county fairs, leaving \$6,319,-044.03 to be met by direct appropriation. To take care of this \$9,167,795.81 the state has in sight revenues aggregating

SUPPORTERS OF IRISH RESOLUTION IN HOUSE COUNTING ON PASSAGE

Favorable Report Is Expected From Committee Offering Instruction to Delegates.

Washington, Dec. 25.—(I. N. S.)—Action will be taken by the house foreign affairs committee soon after the Christmas holidays on the resolution which carries a request from congress to the United States peace commissioners to urge on the peace conference action that will insure for Ireland self-determination of its form of government.

The speeches and arguments in support of such action by congress made two weeks ago by the members of the delegations numbering 200 American men and women of Irish birth or extraction, are being printed by order of the committee and 5000 copies of the pamphlet will soon be ready for uistribution, it was stated today.

It was forecast by members of the house generally that the action of the committee on the resolution will be favorable, and that the resolution will go to the house with the recommendation that it be passed.

Many members of the house, not members of the committee, who are in accord heartily with the principle of the resolution declare they are working actively in its support and are asking the opportunity to advocate it on the They add that they desire to refer to

recent reports of alleged conditions in Ireland, especially the request that the island was being inflamed by Bolshevik agitators from America. The rigidity of the passports regulations enforced by both the United States and the British government makes such a condition impossible, they assert, while information from reliable sources indicates that the political activities in Ireland are of a healthy character and confined mainly to a contest for votes among the Sinn 500.00 Fein and rival political parties."
