PORTLAND MAN IS

H. W. Stone of Local Y. M. C. A. Is Made Chairman of Board to Establish 15 Colleges.

TO TOUR ENTIRE COUNTRY

Plan Involves Building and Equipping Institutions Raising Big Endowment.

Standardizing of the Y. M. C. A. educational system throughout the country, arranging for the construction of 15 first class colleges and raising an endowment of over \$2,000,000 for them, is the task that has been assigned to a special commission of general secretaries in America, of which H. W. Stone, general secretary at Portland, is chairman and executive secretary.

Probably no group of men on the North American continent were ever given an assignment of more importance to the educational world. Mr. Stone has been released by the board of directors of the Portland "Y" for whatever time it may require for him to perform his part of the big task and his first trip to the East in this regard will be made probably early in February.

Mr. Stone will retain his connection

with the Portland association, of which he has long been general secretary, but will be free to devote to the educational feature whatever time is necessary to make of it a success. Others on the commission with him include George Mahhaffey, general secretary at Boston; John Cook, general secretary at Brooklyn, N. Y.; A. G. Studer, general secretary at Detroit: S. Wirt Wiley, general secretary at Minneapolis, and Fred B. Shipp, general secretary at Pittsburg. Stone's Plan Adopted

Details of this big educational plan were made public in Portland yesterday, after arrangements had been completed for Mr. Stone to take up the work, which he had been asked to do after he had presented to a recent conference of metropolitan general secretaries at Atlantic City facts demonstrating that the "Y" as a whole has not been taking advantage of the great opportunities presenting themselves all over the continent of North America and that something should be done to correct this tendency. Mr. Stone's figures, charts and other data was irresistible and the conference immediately named the commission, with power to bring about a condition that will be one of the greatest achievements

in the history of the organization. The first request from Fred B. Shipp, member of the committee, was that Mr. Stone should devote his entire time to the new work, but this Mr. Stone did not wish to do and it was finally agreed, at the urgent request of Dr. John R. Mott, international general secretary that Mr. Stone and his committee shall work through the headquarters office in New York in cooperation with the home vork departmen

Plan for 15 Colleges

Dr. Mott, upon learning of the request diately wrote to W. M. Ladd, president of the board of directors of the Portland association, requesting that they release Mr. Stone for the important work inder consideration and action to this effect was taken.

"I anticipate that it will require about two trips over the country," said Mr. Stone, "and the first probably will be made in February. The metropolitan general secretaries, at their recent convention in Atlantic City, after reviewing the situation, reached the conclusion that the association should take steps to build about 15 colleges, to have these endowed at not less than \$250,000 each and that the work of our Y. M. C. A. schools should be standardized. That is the work cut out for the committee, of which I am chairman and executive mecretary."

That Portland may be one of the cities

on the continent to get one of the colleges, is known to be the hope of Mr. Stone. Portland has one of the best educational departments in the country, both in point of attendance hours and of standard.

Golden Wedding of Couple Celebrated On Christmas Day
