

MULTNOMAH COUNTY PRESBYTERIANS TO LAUNCH NEW ERA MOVE JAN. 20

Team of Men Prominent in Denomination Throughout the Country to Start Things. SUNDAY 'REENLISTMENT DAY' Tomorrow It Is Planned to Enroll Entire Membership to Service of Church and of Fellow Man.

The Presbyterian church in the United States is confronted with the new conditions and problems growing out of the war and has organized a movement to deal with them. This is called the new era movement and is concerned chiefly with the inspiring of the churches so that they may be ready to grapple with these new conditions.

The movement is designed to concentrate the church's activities and aims to create a greater spiritual reawakening and to manage the finances of the church on a modern business basis by presenting one budget instead of many all united under one presentation.

It is now planned to appropriate half a million dollars for stricken Protestant churches in France, Belgium and Italy, and another half million dollars for the reparation of young men who went forth to war from Presbyterian homes and who return from the front wounded and unfitness for normal service.

The old-fashioned American custom of family prayers is to be reestablished in the home, and the young people of the church are to be enlisted as "comrades" of the church.

Some of the district conferences to be held throughout the nation, including the one here in January 20 and 21, are: Rev. William Hiram Foulkes, D. D., formerly of Portland and now located in New York as general secretary of the new era movement.

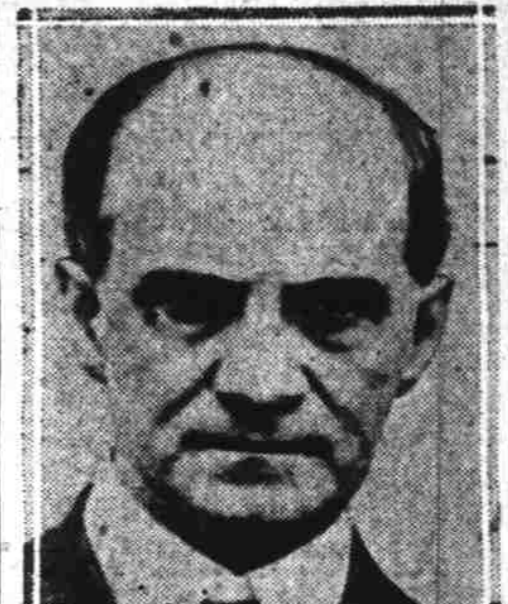
