

OPPOSING POLES MAY FORM UNION

Representatives of Gen. Pilsudski
Are in Paris to Meet Polish
National Committee.

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Paris, Jan. 10.—The long-expected
celebration representing the Polish gov-
ernment in Warsaw has reached Paris
to endeavor to effect an understanding
with the Polish national committee.
The latter is recognized by all the al-
lies, including the United States, as the
only true Polish government, while the
Pilsudski government in Warsaw seems
actually to be governing Poland. The
next few days should show whether a
reconciliation of these two governments
is possible or whether one will be
obliged to give way to the other.
Meanwhile Captain Hugozowsky of the
Pilsudski mission declares:

"We are here to learn what answer
will be made to General Pilsudski's re-
quest, sent through Marshal Poch to
General Haller, to send troops to Po-
land, for the concentration of all our
forces is urgent to repulse the attack
of the Germans on the one hand and
of the Bolsheviks on the other. We in-
tend also to establish relations with
the Polish national committee. Its zeal
and patriotism are indisputable, but
as it is formed chiefly of emigres, they
may be ignorant of certain details of
the present situation. It is certain that
the national need makes an interchange
of views indispensable. Finally, we
hope to regulate the question of Po-
land's entry into the league of nations
and of its diplomatic and consular rep-
resentation in the allied countries."
French Socialists continue to declare
that the allies are trying to force the
Pilsudski government to yield to the
Polish national committee in Paris by
delaying shipments of food and other
necessaries to Poland.

L. Meier, decoration of automobiles; ser-
vice, W. J. Roope; demobilization, Ever-
ett Ames; cooperation, A. F. Flegel. The
appointments are to be confirmed by the
general executive committee appointed
by the mayor.

Fishing Boat Pilgrim Is Brought to Port

Marshfield, Jan. 10.—After having
floated helplessly without a propeller
since Sunday, the gasoline fishing boat
Pilgrim is safe in port. The coast guard
crew from Coos Bay located the boat
20 miles offshore from Marshfield and
towed it into port Thursday. Cap-
tain Andrew Colver and the three men
aboard were safe. The propeller was
lost shortly after the boat left the har-
bor. Her distress was made known by
wireless from a passing vessel, but the
wind changed her position and it was
with difficulty that she was finally
found by the lifesavers.

Socialist Is Fined In Justice Court

South Bend, Wash., Jan. 10.—T. A.
Satterthwaite, a Socialist of this city,
was fined \$25 in a justice court on a
charge of defacing a building. The
testimony brought out the fact that the
defendant had partially torn down an
abandoned building at Camp B. near
this city. Mr. Satterthwaite's plea was
that he supposed it was government
property, had been abandoned and be-
longed to anyone who wanted to take it.

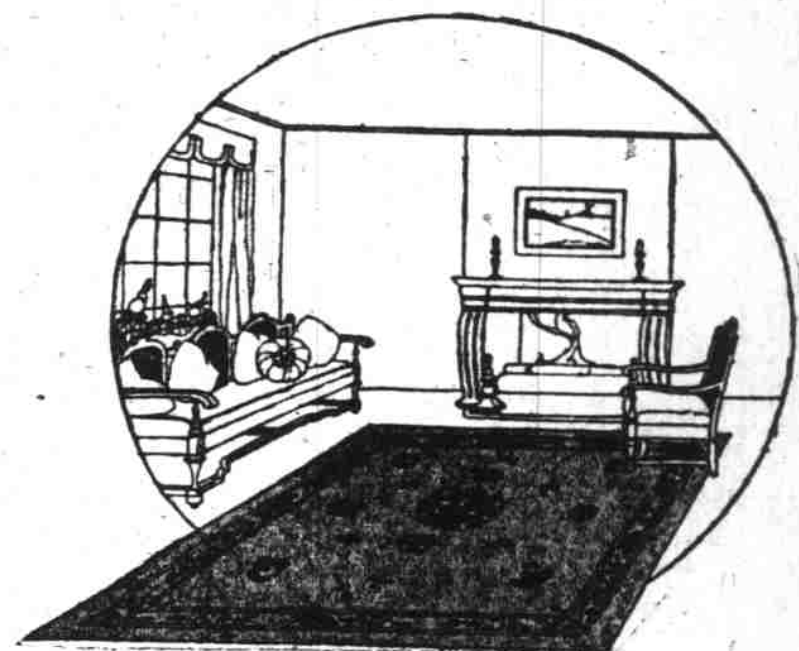
