Olympia, Wash., Feb. 18.—(I. N. S.)—Norman E. Burnett, who confessed to killing his wife and two children, today stands convicted of murder in the first degree by a jury in the superior court here...

Burnett was tried for the murder of his wife, who was the daughter of Mrs. Katherine White, 721 Buena Vista ave. in San Francisco. The Burnetts lived in San Francisco and Fresno before coming to Olympia.

Burnett was found guilty of killing his wife on Hawk Prairie last May and also is accused of slaying his two children, aged 3 and 5 years, at the same time. In Burnett's confession, he stated he accused his wife of infidelity and gave this as the cause of his act.

Washington, Feb. 19.—(I. N. S.)—The United States government will not permit an armed attack upon Nicaragua, if it takes an armed force to prevent it, the state department became known here today, following reports that Costa Rica, under the Tinoco government, was mobilizing a force, said to reach a total of 500 men along the Nicaraguan border.

Indications that Costa Rica believed the United States to encroach with the peace conference and League of Nations to pay attention to the Nicaraguan border, may be met with a display of force, which may take the form of a navy squadron off the coast of that country, it was said.
