

HOUSE SESSION MUST CONTINUE MORNING NEXT WEEK

Desks Packed With Bills From Senate and Wednesday Will Be Probable Adjournment Day.

SENATE MARKS TIME WAITING

Most Important Legislation of Year Hangs Over Because Jam Demands Several More Days.

Salem, Feb. 21.—Their desks jammed with unfinished senate business and with a long list of big bills awaiting action, among which are all the big appropriations bills of the session, house leaders today are preparing to face the inevitable and adjourn on Saturday night until Monday.

At the present rate of progress in the house it will be impossible to clear the desks and effect final adjournment before the small hours of Wednesday morning. Up to this time but relatively few senate bills have gone through the house and the pigeon holes of the chief clerk's desk are full of senate bills while the various house committees have not emptied their pockets of senate measures by any means.

At the same time some of the biggest and most important house bills of the session are far down the calendar and some have not yet been introduced for first reading, among these being the automobile license tax bill and the comprehensive road bill which has been aimed to take the place of Senator Dimick's bills 67 and 68.

House leaders are unanimous in admitting that it will be impossible to reach final adjournment this week, even by grinding continuously throughout tonight and Saturday without wading into a wholesale slaughter of both senate and house bills.

Over on the senate side the decks are clear and the senate is marking time, working part of the day, and not at all at night, waiting to take care of what the house sends it.

It is ready and willing to pass its usual concurrent resolution fixing the time of adjournment at Saturday night, which would, of course, be adjourned unless the house would concur. Should this happen there would be the biggest last night slaughter and confusion that has ever marked the close of an Oregon legislative session, and it does not seem

REPORT KILLS BILL FOR EXAMINATION OF RIVER AT CASCADES

Other Measures Are Postponed Indefinitely by Adverse Reports to Senate.

Salem, Feb. 21.—By adopting an adverse report from the ways and means committee, the senate today indefinitely postponed senate bill 263, which appropriated \$10,000 for making Oregon's share of the cost of making an investigation of the Columbia river at Cascade Locks with the idea of recommending improvement in the river which would facilitate river traffic.

There is no discussion of the bill or the adverse report.

Other bills were indefinitely postponed in the same manner, as follows:

S. B. 243, by Handley—Prohibiting surety companies from issuing bonds to other corporations in which their own members are interested.

S. B. 193, by Gill—Appropriating \$20,000 for cooperation with the federal government in making topographic maps in Oregon.

H. E. 128, by Edwards—Authorizing the state labor commissioner to conduct educational work to prevent bodily injury.

H. B. 50, by Cross—Providing that a person must be a resident of a county in which suit is instituted before action can be commenced for divorce.

H. B. 338, by Thrift—Providing for county meat and herd inspectors.

H. B. 323, by Schuebel—To prohibit the buying of junk from milorgs.

H. B. 16, by Schuebel—Increasing the annual license fees of domestic corporations.

BORAH SEES WORLD LED BY BRITAIN

umph for "British diplomacy," he shouted.

Borah demanded that the League of Nations constitution be submitted to the American people in a general election before they are pledged by the president and the senate to support it.

He bitterly attacked former President Taft, who said the adoption of the constitution would not abrogate the Monroe doctrine or the Washingtonian policy of no entangling alliances.

"The English press as a unit regards the constitution as abrogating the Monroe doctrine. Lloyd George said England could concede much, if it were able through its concessions to draw America away from its traditional foreign policy."

"Japan semi-officially announces that the constitution abolishes the Monroe doctrine. The Brazilian minister at the Hague announces the opinion. Why are the American people told it does not?"

"We have surrendered a traditional power established for a hundred years," said Borah. "This is the first step in internationalism—this is the first admission that we have to depend upon the international state to preserve our integrity."

"From the beginning of the preamble to the end of the constitution of the league there is recognition of the idea that the United States must substitute internationalism for nationalism. He admitted that a nation-wide vote on the League of Nations would be difficult to secure."

"But it should be done," he continued, "because the issues involved affect these people for all time to come."

"The American people have the undoubted right to change their form of government whenever they see fit," Borah asserted. "I concede their right to make such changes in as orderly a fashion as may be approved by their judgment."
