

Twenty-nine Baptist Churches in State Are Over Two in Victory Campaign

EXTRA ALLOTMENT OF BAPTISTS IS YET TO BE RAISED

Victory Campaign to Raise \$6,000,000 for Advancement of Work of Missions, Is Project

ALL MUST BE IN BY MARCH 30

Intention Is to Start New Church Year Which Will Begin April 1 With Entirely Clean Slate.

Twenty-nine Baptist churches in the state, 11 of which are in Portland, have already raised in cash their apportionments in the Victory campaign that is being waged throughout the nation by the Northern Baptist convention.

The Victory campaign is a drive within the Baptist churches of the northern states to raise \$6,000,000. The drive dates are March 23 to 30. March 31 the church year closes and in order to give the denomination a clean slate for the new year the members must respond to the call.

The Victory campaign is a laymen's movement. It originated in the mind of Ambrose Swasey, a prominent layman in the church, who wondered why the soldiers of Christ and the members of the church couldn't do the same great things accomplished by the government and the army during the war.

Dr. Alfonso M. Petty, who is district secretary of home and foreign missions in the Northwest, said recently that Oregon is leading all the states in his district in meeting its apportionment.

Dr. Petty and Rev. F. C. Lalette will leave Sunday for the Deschutes region and Crook county on a tour in the interior of the state.
