

SORENSEN CLEARED OF MANSLAUGHTER

Circuit Court Jury Finds Verdict of Not Guilty for Defendant in Mina Smith Killing.

N. P. Sorenson, on trial in Circuit Judge Kavanaugh's court for the killing of Mrs. Mina Smith, was found not guilty of involuntary manslaughter by a jury last night. Sorenson was accused of running down and killing Mrs. Smith with his automobile, at West Park and Oak streets, the evening of December 26.

Testifying in his own behalf, Sorenson told the jury that about noon the day of the accident he took two drinks; that he left his office in the Chamber of Commerce building about 5:20 o'clock in the evening and waited until 5:30 o'clock for Chester Sorenson, his son, and that then he proceeded straight up Stark street in his automobile to his home at 1021 Quimby street.

Al. H. Birrell, appearing for the defense, testified that he was a neighbor of Sorenson and that the morning following the death of Mrs. Smith he rode downtown with Sorenson. Witness said he did not notice that the headlight of Sorenson's machine was bent, nor did he see a package between the hood and the guard of the machine.

Tie Manufacturers To Meet in Portland Saturday, March 29

A meeting of members of the Western Oregon Tie & Lumber association will be held in the Portland hotel March 29 at 8 p. m. Instead of March 22, as previously announced, according to C. H. Ball, secretary of the association. Tie and lumber manufacturers from Western Washington will also be invited to attend the meeting. Concerted action will be inaugurated at this gathering toward securing modifications of recent rulings of the United States railroad administration governing the inspection and purchase of cross ties.

Managers of the 150 Willamette valley mills engaged in the manufacture declare that it will be impossible to operate at a profit under existing conditions. Urgent appeals have been forwarded to government officials in Washington, D. C., by the tie and lumber men but no relief has been promised them.
