316th SANITARY TRAIN WANTS TO COME THIS WAY

Wireless Message Is Received Asking That Outfit Be Routed Through Portland.

EFFORT IS BEING MADE

Attempt to Gratify Wish of Boys Is Being Made—Some of Oldest Men in Point of Service.

ACCIDENT LAD TO VANCOUVER YOUTH

James Vest, son of W. L. Vest, Is Held as Alleged Driver of Car That Killed Racette.

Vancouver, Wash., April 21.—On information furnished by Sheriff Alexander of Hillsboro, Or., James Vest, son of W. L. Vest of 111 Main street, was taken into custody this morning by the police and held for the Washington county sheriff, who is expected today.

Vest is charged with having driven the car which struck George Racette, an aged citizen of Tigard, causing injuries which were not in France as long as some of the other units in his divisions, are some of the oldest boys in the service of those who enlisted for the duration of the war.

COAST CREELS MAKE HEROES FROM THE PIAVE

Only American Troops Engaged With Italians Parade Up Fifth Avenue Shortly After Arrival.

THREE GOVERNORS PRESENT Boys Are First of Returning Units From Other States to March in New York.

New York, April 21.—(I. N. S.)—New York gave a noisy reception today to the 323d infantry regiment, heroes of the Piave river fighting and the only American troops to be engaged with the Italian army.

The governors of three states, New York, Ohio and Pennsylvania, reviewed the 323d infantry, who were the first of the returning units from other states to march in parade in New York. Thousands of Italians and members of races composing the new Sixty-ninth, lined Fifth avenue and cheered the marchers.

The regiment, carrying full equipment, was taken into custody this morning by the police and held for the Washington county sheriff, who is expected today.
