

STATE HOSPITAL CONTINGENT UPON TWO MEASURES

Amendment to Permit Building of
Institution and "Reconstruction
Bonding Bill" Must Pass.

SITE CAUSES COMPLICATION

Before Plan Can Be Worked Out
Voters Must Grant Authority
to Build Outside of Marion.

Following is a discussion of the second measure to be on the ballot at the special election of June 3, next. The short ballot title by which it is currently spoken of is "Industrial and Reconstruction Hospital Amendment." Its numbers on the ballot are "302-Yes" and "302-No." Those electors who believe that the amendment should be adopted will mark their ballots "302XYes." Those who are opposed to the adoption of the amendment will mark their ballots "302XNo."

The second measure upon the ballot at the special election of June 3 is a proposed constitutional amendment authorizing the erection of a "reconstruction hospital" at Portland, upon the site of the medical department of the University of Oregon.

Several years ago the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company donated a site on Marquam hill, for the use of the medical department of the University of Oregon. The constitution requires that all public institutions shall be located at the seat of government, Marion county, unless the people of the state by a definite vote on a specific proposition shall decide that such an institution may be located in some other part of the state. It was under this pro-

cedure that the Medical college was authorized to be located on Marquam hill, and it is because of this constitutional limitation that the question of the location of the reconstruction hospital at Portland is now being submitted to the people for their approval.

NO CHARGES FIXED
The reconstruction hospital amendment, should it be approved, would carry no appropriation or fix no charge or debt upon the people of the state. Its only effect would be to grant the authority to construct such an institution at some place other than Marion county. It is connected, however, with the general reconstruction program as contained in the \$5,000,000 bonding bill which will also be on the ballot for the consideration of the voters. This bill, the ballot title of which is the "Reconstruction Bonding Bill," the ballot numbers being "312-Yes" and "312-No," provides for the construction of the hospital in section 4, which says:

"At such time after the taking effect of this act as such board (the State Board of Control) shall deem advisable the state board of control shall issue and sell not to exceed \$5,000,000 in amount of said reconstruction bonds and proceed to use the proceeds thereof in the construction of public buildings of the state of Oregon, and for land settlement as follows: * * * An Oregon state reconstruction hospital to be constructed on the campus of the medical college of the University of Oregon, at Portland, and to be used in affiliation with the medical school at a cost not to exceed \$350,000."

BILLS HAND IN HAND

It will be seen therefore that the approval of the amendment and the enactment of the bonding bill must go hand in hand to bring about the construction of the hospital. Should the amendment be not ratified by the voters, the state board of control would have no specific authority to construct the hospital at Portland. Should the amendment be approved and the bill fail to receive the approval of a majority of the electors voting on the question, there would be no funds provided with which the building could be erected. Both must be favorably acted upon on June 3, or the reconstruction hospital project will fail.

There is one other phase of the question which has not been brought prominently before the public, and that is the fact that the construction or the non-construction, not only of the hospital project but of the entire public building program specified in the \$5,000,000 bonding bill, lies entirely in the discretion of the state board of control.

The primary purpose sought to be accomplished by the enactment of the reconstruction program submitted by the legislature is the control of the unemployment problem during the coming fall and winter, or until the period of readjustment following the close of the war has been bridged. Therefore the \$5,000,000 bonding bill which is the basis of the reconstruction program, does not of necessity mean that the state board of control will spend the \$5,000,000 provided for the erection of public buildings, but simply that it will be given the authority and the means to construct any or all of the buildings specified, should unemployment conditions in the state cause the state board of control to consider that such state activity was necessary to control the conditions.

As to the reconstruction hospital project, it is pointed out by its sponsors that it is intended the hospital shall provide for injured workmen such facilities for physical reconstruction and training as will enable them to earn a livelihood. The plan is to give to men employed in the various hazardous occupations and industries of the state the same benefits which the United States government is providing for the training and crippled soldiers. The state industrial accident commission is now paying out from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per month for hospital fees and incidentals for injured working men and should the reconstruction hospital be built the monthly expenditures of the industrial accident commission would be sufficient to maintain it. Maimed soldiers could also be taken care of at the hospital.
