Appointment Hinges on Opinion by Attorney General as to Validity of Legislative Act.

Salem, May 30 .- Captain Jacob Kansler will be Governor Olcott's choice for judge of the new court of domestic relations for Multnomah county, the governor announced Thursday night, providing the press reports of the recomendations of the Multnomah county circuit judges are verified by the official report of Thursday's proceedings. The appointment, however, will be held in abeyance, pending the receipt of an opinion from Attorney General Brown relative to the constitutionality and validity of the law enacted by the recent legislature creating the new court which has been questioned by District Attorney Evans of Multnomah county. The governor has asked the attorney general for an opinion on the law and in the event the opinion upholds the law the appointment will follow immediately.


