THE "fickle, inconstant moon" sways the designs for Summer attire. It may be said that gowns and wraps are being designed with one eye on the placid orb. Consciously or unconsciously there arises in the mind of the director of a Summer wardrobe, "How will this garment or that look by the rays of moonlight?"

I present to you three creations that will bear the test of moonshine. The kimono-like wrap shown in the middle figure of the group is an instance. Of rich, yet light weight, brocade is this evening cloak, which I have called "Prince Igor." You will note the Occidental modifications of being draped upward at one side and attached at the shoulder. The collar

and cuffs are of fur arranged with what I deem a fascinating irregularity of straight bands of fur alternating with motifs that are an adaptation of the Greek key. Worn over an evening gown of black tulle, this wrap invites the caresses of the silvery moonbeams and reflects them in beautiful and fantastic fashion.

The small left-hand figure is an evening gown of tulle made over satin and trimmed with ribbon and flat floral effects. This girlish robe I christened "She Dances."

The right-hand picture is that of a tulle and silver evening gown. The arrangement of the drapery over one shoulder is graceful and unique. To this delicately beautiful creation I have given the title, which I think you will agree is fitting, "Hail, Eros."
