

### SUFFRAGISTS ASK SPECIAL SESSIONS

#### Early Ratification of Constitutional Amendment Sought by Women.

Washington, June 4.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—Governor Olcott of Oregon, in common with other governors, will soon be besieged by suffragists to call an extra session of the legislature to ratify the suffrage amendment in accordance with the new slogan of Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, president of the National Suffrage association, extra sessions and immediate ratification. This will be urged with the object of securing ratification in time for women to vote in every state at the presidential election next year.

#### Ratification Is Sought

Springfield, Ill., June 5.—(U. P.)—State Senator Cornwell today introduced a joint resolution in the senate for ratification of the national suffrage amendment adopted by the United States senate late Wednesday. Under the rules, the resolution lays over one legislative day.

### ATTORNEY FOR MRS. DIBBERN SAYS CLIENT NOT LEAVING STATE

### Bench Warrant Issued at Instigation of Lawyer Keeley Is Cause for Indignation.

Indignant denial was made today by C. A. Hart, attorney for Mrs. Edna Blanche Dibbern, of charges made by Lee Roy E. Keeley, who is endeavoring by legal action to gain a fee of \$1600 from Mrs. Dibbern. Keeley had sworn out a bench warrant for Mrs. Dibbern's appearance in the circuit court on the ground that she was leaving the state and the jurisdiction of the court. As a matter of fact, Mrs. Dibbern was at her usual work at the Grant Smith-Porter Ship company plant this morning and has been at work constantly for a month, the company reported. It was at this shipyard that her husband was killed several months ago, for which Mrs. Dibbern obtained from the industrial accident commission a settlement of \$4000. For alleged legal services in obtaining this settlement, Keeley is now claiming a 40 per cent fee. Hart declared this morning that his firm was representing Mrs. Dibbern in the effort to resist action by Keeley, inasmuch as Keeley is alleged to have offered to get judgment for Mrs. Dibbern on the basis of friendship and sympathy.

Hart told the court he would produce his client this afternoon without the necessity of serving the bench warrant.

#### LAZARUS PRESENTS CLAIM

Architect Wants More Money for Vista House Work.

Another claim of Edgar M. Lazarus for \$7249.13 for services rendered in connection with the plans of the Vista house presented Wednesday to the commissioners was referred by them to Walter Evans, district attorney.

Mr. Lazarus has been paid \$7250 for his work in drawing up the plans of the Vista house and an additional claim for \$6868.42 presented by him was denied by the commissioners last fall. At that time it was reported to the commissioners by District Attorney Evans that Mr. Lazarus had been paid in full according to the statement of John E. Yoon, who, as roadmaster, had employed Mr. Lazarus as architect for the Vista house. It was upon this report that the commissioners refused the claim.
