VESSEL WAS DELAYED SEVERAL DAYS ON SAN FRANCISCO-PORTLAND TRIP BECAUSE OF BAD WEATHER.

The Japanese tramp steamer Shippo Maru, which arrived in Portland early today, was built in Japan in 1918 to carry lumber for China. In spite of her brief existence, she already shows the appearance of having been in service for several years. The elements have left their imprint on the exposed steel plates to such a degree that at first sight one would believe that the ship had been in service several years.

NEW SHIPS LUXURIOUS, GLYMONT, WHICH LEAVES TONIGHT, FURNISHED WITH MANY CONVENIENCES.

In marked contrast with the old time freighters is the degree of comfort furnished officers and crew of the modern freighter of the Glymont type. The new 2800-ton steel steamer Glymont, Captain A. McKenna, built by the Albina Shipbuilding Machine Works at Portland, which sails this evening for Seattle to join the fleet of the Matson Navigation company, is an example of the comfort and convenience of the vessels that sail on Uncle Sam's ships these days. The captain's quarters reminds one of the apartment houses of the city. The master has a private bath, which includes a shower, hot and cold water and even salt water is available. The cabin is supplied with a choice collection of books. The quarters of the chief engineer and his assistants are furnished with the officers' dining saloon is finished with hard wood and comfortable, stationary swivel chairs are provided. The electric lights are of the modern type and here are kept the fresh meats and perishable edibles needed on the long ocean voyage. The ship's own ice-making plant keeps the refrigerator room down to 34 degrees below zero. An electric bell manipulated from the bridge by the crew in case anyone happens to get accidentally locked in the cold room, at the imminent peril of being frozen to death. The ship's radio is a modern room, wireless telegraph and adequate fire fighting apparatus. Before the Glymont started on her voyage her engines were given a final dock trial by her own crew and all was found in perfect order. The triple expansion engines, made by the Brown Engine and Machine works, develop 1000 horse power. Oil is used as fuel, but grades for the engine and for the coal burner are available on shipboard. The Glymont will go on the run from Seattle, San Francisco to Honolulu. A part cargo of the freight was taken on board for Honolulu.

PLANS FOR FERRYBOAT Craft for Use at Independence to Cost About \$2600.

Plans have been drawn for the construction of a new ferryboat to run across the river at Independence. The boat will be built by the Albina Shipbuilding Machine Works at Portland. It will be a double-decked vessel, with a cabin on the lower deck and a deck on the upper. The boat will be 40 feet long and 12 feet wide. It will be powered by a 20-horsepower engine. The boat will be used to carry passengers and freight across the river at Independence. The cost of the boat is estimated at \$2600.
