Shinpo Maru, Built Last Year, Looks as if She Had Been in Service for Years.

The Japanese tramp steamer Shinpo Maru, which arrived in Portland early today, was built in Japan in 1918 to load lumber for China. In spite of her brief existence, she already shows the appearance of hard usage at sea. The elements have left their imprint on the exposed steel plates to such a degree that at first sight one would believe that | 3:30 the ship had been in service several vears.

The Shinpo is a vessel of 6890 deadweight tons and has a speed of 10 knots. It required three months in which to build the ship, which is furnished with triple-expansion compound engines. Captaein G. Arrival of the tramp in the local har bor was delayed several days on account of a severe storm encountered just after the vessel had left San Francisco for the Columbia river. Head northwest winds vere met. In an endeavor to buck these adverse conditions liberal use of the coal in the ship's bunker was used. So great was the drain on the supply of fuel that it was found necessary to return to San Francisco after a futile attempt to proceed against the storm. After taking on 150 tons of coal at the Bay City the steamer proceeded on her way.
