LOWLY BEAVERS CONTINUE CLIMB AT END OF 12TH

Penner Stars in Lively Contest That Was Tied From Sixth Frame, Pitching Quality Ball and Establishing Renewed Morale in Rally That Bottled Score.

PORTLAND won its fifth straight contest Thursday, but it required 12 innings of hot baseball and "Brick" Eldred's juggling stunt to put the Mackmen on the long end of a 3 to 2 score. With Ken Penner on second base as the result of his second hit of the contest and Rader's sacrifice, Wisterzil singled to center and Eldred, after fielding the ball and setting himself to throw, let the ball slip out of his hands and Penner trotted across the plate.

Penner was the hero of the game. In addition to his brilliant pitching—the feat of holding the Yippers, who are pretty heavy hitters, to six blows in a dozen innings—he started the rally that put the Beavers 2½ games behind Sacramento for sixth position in the league race. Penner did not allow a hit after the seventh inning and issued only one walk, passing McGaffigan in the tenth frame.

Opposing Penner on the mound was "Dazzle" Vance, who, although touched up for 13 bingles, managed to keep them pretty well scattered, save in the three innings that the Beavers put across their tallies.

BEAVERS STAY WITH IT

Bill Rodgers' men started off like winners in the second frame when they garnered two runs, but the Beavers, who are playing like real champions, fought all the way and evened up the count in the sixth frame, and from then on it was a tight battle.

Orr's single to right field and Rader's hot of Pinelli's grounder followed by a long double to the left center field by Gus Fisher counted the markers for Sacramento.

The Beavers came back with a run on Signin's hit, over second. Walker's beaten-out roller down the third base line and Cox's single over McGaffigan's head, however, allowed the Yippers to complete a double play on Penner's roller to Pinelli, after Pinelli had fumbled the ball, Baker being forced out at third and Cox doubled at second.

SCORE IS TIED
Baker's Texas leaguer, after Signin and Walker had been retired in the sixth, followed by Cox's double in practically the same spot as Fisher, put over the tying run.

The Yippers looked dangerous in their half of the sixth, when Eldred singled and stole, but Griggs, Middleton and Orr were unable to connect with Penner's hooks. Wisterzil had a chance in the seventh to bat in a run with McGaffigan on second as the result of his walk and steal, but he grounded to Eldred. In the twelfth inning, Penner and M. Vance were unable to connect after Orr had reached second on Rader's third base hit and Pinelli's single.

ELDRED DROPS BALL

Penner tried to rally in the ninth after two were down, with a single through short, but Rader fouled out to Griggs. In the twelfth, however, the Beavers heaver surprised himself by cracking one over Orr's head into right field. Rader moved him up with a sacrifice and Wisterzil smacked a sharp single to center. This put Penner on third and he would have been caught at the plate, as Eldred fielded the ball in good style, and set himself to make the tag, but he dropped it. Penner scrambled for the plate upon the advice of Coach Oldham. It was a tough game for Vance to lose.

The Beavers had a dandy chance to rally in the fourth when Signin doubled and Walker drew a base on balls, but Eldred and Cox fanned and Penner grounded out to Orr.
