

MORE FIR TRIBUTARY TO PORTLAND THAN TO SEATTLE SHOWN

Records Compiled Which May
Secure Location of Big Sash
and Door Factory Here.

Analysis of timber records held by the forest service department of the department of agriculture proves conclusively that there is twice as much Douglas fir standing in the territory tributary to the Columbia river as there is in the Puget sound district, says the director of the forest service in a letter to W. H. Crawford, manager of the department of Industries of the Chamber of Commerce.

In the Columbia river district, which includes the Willamette river basin as far south as Cottage Grove, and east to the Cascades and the Peninsula district, there is 160,000,000,000 feet of timber ready to cut.

PUGET SOUND FIGURES

In the Puget sound district, including the west side of the Cascades from the British Columbia line south to the Lewis-Cowitt county line, there is 80,000,000,000 feet of timber available. For the Columbia river there is also an additional quantity of timber available in the state of Washington, in districts tributary to the river.

This information was requested by the department of Industries to be presented to a million dollar sash and door company located in the middle west which wishes to locate on the Pacific coast and was desirous of knowing the amount of timber available in the various districts. The report also eliminates the general impression that because numerous hillsides were logged off that the Puget sound district had more standing timber available.

RAILROADS BEING BUILT

Mr. Crawford also received a communication from John Pearson, president of the Gales Creek & Wilson River railroad company, bringing the information that railroad lines are being extended all through the vast timber regions between Portland and the coast and that the railroad extension will open up these timber places which the forest service director recorded as available.

Mr. Pearson says that the following roads are now being extended: The Lewis-Clark road, which is being extended to the Kerry road, with terminal near Westport; the Portland & Southeastern railroad, with terminal near Scappoose; the Gales Creek & Wilson River road, now building into Gales creek valley and intending to construct a road up Wilson river valley and then to Tillamook.

NOT THOUGHT WON

The forest service report states that the Puget sound district probably has 10 to 15 per cent more yellow pine than the Willamette valley district, which runs more into second growth Douglas fir. The communications will be furnished to the sash and door mill directors and it is believed that the data furnished will assure the mill for the Columbia river district.

The hero and his family attended a meeting at the auditorium Monday night where he was presented on behalf of the state with a diamond encrusted medal for valor. The mountain bride received a handsome brooch from the suffragists.

The mother, wearing a sun-bonnet and dressed in plain black, white and white skirt, was presented and stood smilingly and unafraid as she was cheered when termed by Governor Roberts as "the mother of the world's greatest hero."

J. G. Chambers, well known Portland veteran of the Civil war, has been designated by the commander in chief of the organization as his official representative for the Northwest, including Oregon, Idaho, Washington and Alaska.

As senior vice commander, Mr. Chambers will be in authority next to Commander Adams, whose headquarters are at Omaha.

Mr. Chambers has been a member of the Grand Army for 40 years and is a past department commander of Oregon. He is the sole survivor of the third generation of Chamberses since the Revolution, his grandfather having served in that war and died in 1856 at the age of 101.

Mr. Chambers' father, born in 1791, served in the war of 1812 and died in 1879. Mr. Chambers was born in 1845 and served through the Civil war.
