WATE ON THE AGARISTA SUICIDE, SAYS SHERIFF

Found the mate lying there across the floor, with bullet holes through his head and blood oozing. Then I signalled for the tug and sent the body ashore...

"Did you hear any shots fired?" the captain was asked. "I think I did. I heard something and then I thought some article had fallen."

A closer investigation of the cabin showed the gun lying on the table. Investigation showed it to be loaded with empty. The captain said he did not know where the gun had been found and did not remember who picked it up, but supposed the body was shot there.

The hearing of Captain Nielsen and the members of the crew is being held today privately in the office of the sheriff.

Frank O'Connor, general agent for the Pacific Steamship company, manager of operators of the wooden steamer Agarista, today received a letter from Captain Jacob Nielsen, master of the vessel, expressing the view that the first mate, Frank J. Sale, who died from gunshot wounds inflicted while on board the vessel, had committed suicide.

Manager O'Connor stated that Captain Nielsen had not been placed in custody another captain would be employed to take out the ship. The steamer is now coaling at Astoria and will finish the evening in the Hartman wharf, where the vessel is loaded with ties and her destination is New York.

Captain Nielsen, who lives at 208 Columbia street, Portland, is well known in this city and his many friends express the belief that he is absolutely innocent of any connection with the tragedy.

He was formerly mate on the steel steamer Point Lobos, built by the Albia Engine & Machine Co. of California, and was later assigned to the Agarista. He held a commission in the U. S. navy during the war and was for a number of years master of the lightship Columbia.

J. S. Michael, steward on the Agarista, lives at 1052 Cleveland avenue, Portland. During the war he was commissioned as captain in the quartermaster's department and was promoted to major. He was on duty in New Jersey.
