FORMAL ACTION TO BE LATER

Document Will Be Submitted to Congregations of City in Order to Keep Them Informed.

The executive committee of the Portland Ministerial association has sent to the pastors of the city the following constitution, to be acted upon finally Monday night in the great mass meeting in the First Methodist church...

In the presence of God the time has come to fully manifest the essential oneness of the Christian churches of America in Jesus Christ as their living Lord and Savior...

Article I—Name The name of this organization shall be "The Portland Federation of Churches," being such churches as agree with the preamble.

Article II—Object The object of this federation shall be to promote the welfare, unity and cooperation of the churches and to foster community betterment.

Article III—Membership Section 1. This federation shall be composed of those churches in the city of Portland and vicinity that shall, by vote, agree by their respective authorized methods to unite with this organization...

Section 2. Any church in the federation may be expelled from the federation by the council at any time upon the request of two-thirds of the members of the council...

Section 4. Any church that shall vote according to the authority of the constitution shall be held in writing such action to the council.
