

# EXAMINING BOARD FOR ENGINEERS IS NAMED BY OLCOTT

O. Laugaard, J. C. Strong, E. G. Hopson and Fred D. Weber Are Portland Experts Selected. WILL SERVE WITHOUT PAY

R. R. Bartlett, G. A. Covell, W. B. Dennis, Frank S. Bailee Are Other Members of Commission

Salem, July 1.—The members of the state board of engineering examiners, created under act of the last legislature, were announced by Governor Olcott on Monday. Under this act the board is to be composed of nine members, two of whom must be civil engineers, two mechanical engineers, two mining engineers, two hydraulic engineers, and one electrical engineer. Three of the members are appointed for a two-year term, three for a four-year term, and three for a six-year term, from July 1, 1918. The members of the board, together with the date on which their terms expire, are as follows: Civil engineers—R. R. Bartlett, Astoria, 1921; O. Laugaard, Portland, 1922. Mechanical engineers—G. A. Covell, Corvallis, 1925; J. C. Strong, Portland, 1921. Mining engineers—W. B. Dennis, Carlton, 1915; Frank S. Bailee, Baker, 1922. Hydraulic engineers—E. G. Hopson, Portland, 1925; John H. Lewis, Vale, 1923. Electrical engineer—Fred D. Weber, Portland, 1921. The members of this board serve without compensation other than traveling and other necessary expenses. The board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of the board, at a salary of \$1200 per year. The law creating this board provides that they shall conduct examinations for persons desiring to practice professional engineering within the state, and that after January 1, 1921, no person shall practice without first having obtained a certificate.

Salem, July 1.—Three state officials appointed by Governor Olcott within the past month assumed their new duties today. These are J. W. Ferguson and Will T. Kirk, newly appointed members of the state industrial accident commission, and Louis H. Compton, who succeeds Joseph H. Keller as state parole officer. Ferguson came from Portland Monday night and Kirk has been with the commission as claim agent for the past two months. Compton resigned as general secretary of the Salem Y. M. C. A. to accept the state appointment.

### Many to Enter Horse Show

Salem, July 1.—The horse show will be the society event of the state fair here according to Secretary A. H. Lea. Already the Vancouver, Portland, San Francisco and Victoria, B. C., riding clubs have signified their intention of entering the show, and other entrants are expected.

### American Products Are Still Pouring Across to Europe

Washington, July 1.—Millions of pounds of products of American packing houses are still being sent overseas to feed hungry Europeans, according to figures made public today by the department of commerce, showing the exports of meat products during May. Great Britain was the heaviest buyer. Shipments to that country during May included 4,287,185 pounds of fresh beef, 32,500,000 pounds of bacon, 30,500,000 hams and shoulders, 18,500,000 pounds of lard, together with large quantities of canned beef, pickled beef, oleomargarine oil, pickled pork and lard compounds.

### Cooks and Waiters Strike in Astoria

Astoria, July 1.—One hundred and fifty cooks and waiters are scheduled to strike here today because proprietors of eating houses refused to meet their demands for higher wages and shorter hours. Hotels and restaurants would not agree to sign a contract with the union embodying in it the demands of the workers.

### Boxing Measure Vetoed

Springfield, Ill., July 1.—(U. P.)—Illinois' 18 round boxing bill, passed by both houses of the state legislature, was dead today. Governor Lowden vetoed the measure last night because, he said, he believes it unconstitutional.

### "Booze" Dispute Causes Shooting

New York, July 1.—(L. N. S.)—A dispute over the purchase of "just one more last drink" resulted in the shooting of Joseph Deambro, 30, early today. He was shot in the back and seriously wounded.

### MANY TAKE BEER RISK

Beer, and in some instances light wines, were being sold in many cities, according to reports received here. These advices indicated there was much confusion as to what Attorney General Palmer would do about enforcing the law with regard to beer containing 2.75 per cent alcohol. Palmer's official statement was interpreted generally as meaning that dealers could continue to sell such beer at their own risk, and many took the risk.

### Opinions varied widely as to what constituted complete demobilization, drys asserting it would not be complete until the navy and army were both down to a peace footing, which would carry war time prohibition right into constitutional.

War time prohibition was voted by congress as a rider to the agricultural appropriation bill of 1918. It was intended to conserve foodstuffs which were going into the manufacture of drink. Representative Barkley, Kentucky, introduced the rider.

### Attack on Yanks By Japanese Not Yet Closed Book

Washington, July 1.—(L. N. S.)—The situation growing out of the attack of Japanese soldiers upon American troops in the French concession at Tien Tsin, China, last March, is not yet a closed book.

### General P. Stewart Heintzelman, acting Secretary of State Phillips today said: "The affair has not been satisfactorily settled as yet."

It is understood that apologies have been made to the consul general for the violence of the Japanese, but that the state department will not regard the matter closed until there has been an apology to the state department here and until there have been definite assurances that steps have been taken to prevent a recurrence of the trouble.

and we are presuming that is what is meant in the wartime prohibition act as passed by congress.

Palmer said, however, that it is not his intention to order wholesale arrests at present.

"We are endeavoring to get an immediate authoritative court decision as to what constitutes intoxicating beer in a case being tried today in Baltimore," he said.

"In the meantime, district attorneys have not been authorized to ignore the sale of beer, nor have they been instructed to make arrests. My statement last night is the only instructions that have gone out.

"When congress clearly defines what constitutes intoxicating beer our course will be clear."

"The first test case the department had in New York was lost. It was held by the court that the question of what constitutes an intoxicating beer is a question of fact in each instance.

"It would mean that if we arrested thousands over the country, in the light of the present court rulings we would have to make a jury case of each arrest.

"In the meantime we contend that the sale of beer is in violation of the law. If a court decision is delayed or congress is slow in passing enforcement laws, we may find it necessary to make wholesale arrests throughout the country."
