

TILLAMOOK TO HAVE GREAT CELEBRATION ON FOURTH OF JULY

Judge R. R. Butler of The Dalles to Be Orator; Log Rolling Contest on Program.

Tillamook, July 3.—At the last meeting of the Fourth of July committee plans for the biggest celebration ever held in Tillamook were completed. In the morning an air salute, flag-raising and a big parade will be followed by contests of all kinds, including log-rolling. About \$300 in money prizes will be given. The reading of the Declaration of Independence and an oration by Judge R. R. Butler of The Dalles will also be morning features.

In the afternoon and evening the Knights of Pythias band will give street concerts, a baseball team composed of members of the K. of P. lodge of N. Tillamook will play a team made up of members of Marathon lodge No. 88, K. of P., of Tillamook.

AERO CLUB TO BE ORGANIZED AS PART OF SALEM'S FOURTH

Salem, July 3.—The organization of the Salem Aero club will be consummated with the dedication of Olcott field, named in honor of Oregon's flying governor, as a part of the Fourth of July program here. This will be the second club of its kind within the state. Governor Olcott is to be made honorary flight commander of the Salem flying field at this same ceremony. Milton R. Klepper of Portland, president of the Aero Club of Oregon, will preside.

YAKIMA-OWNED AIRPLANES TO GIVE FLIGHTS ON JULY FOURTH

Lieutenant Parshall will give exhibitions here and carry passengers.
