

LEASE OF PROPERTY FOR FILLING STATION CAUSE OF COMMENT

Action of Southern Pacific May
Lead to Move to Block
Project By Council.

Medford, July 2.—Much comment was caused when it became known that the Southern Pacific Railroad company, whose line bisects the business district of Medford and which for half a block on either side of the tracks owns the land through the business section, has leased the northwest corner of West Main and North Fir streets to the Standard Oil company, which will establish a retail service station there.

The railroad has always heretofore refused to lease any of its land, except for warehouse purposes. Learning of the lease made to the Standard Oil company, the city council at once applied to the railroad company for a lease of the southeast corner of Main and Front streets where it desires to establish a similar service station.

It is rumored that the city council may pass legislation refusing entrance for vehicles from either West Main or North Fir street to the Standard station.
