

SNAGS LOOMING BEFORE MEASURE TO AID VETERANS

Soldier Settlement Measure May Pass House in Such Form That Its Defeat Will Be Outcome

LOBBY AGAINST IT ACTIVE

Private Colonization Lobbyists Stand in Its Way, Styling It 'Paternalistic' and Unnecessary

Washington, July 11.—(WASH.—)The prospects for enactment of the Lane-Mondell soldier settlement land bill are less encouraging than they were earlier in the session. It is expected to pass the house in the near future, but there is danger that it will be amended in such a way as to cause complications and ultimately its defeat.

There is an active lobby against it, financed by those who want to make dividends from private colonization schemes.

They denounce it as "paternalistic," and say that private capital can do the work. Their arguments are the same as were used in the campaign against the federal farm loan act. Such prominent men as Senator Harding of Ohio, former Senator Weeks of Massachusetts and Myron T. Herrick of Ohio are revealed back of this propaganda.

RUMOR OF PROFIT
The opposition has fostered the belief that the plan involves some scheme of land speculation, and that the bill is for the benefit of irrigation in the West and the swamp lands of the South. This helps to arouse sectional objection from the Middle West and East.

Arguments are also made that it will tend to depopulate the more closely settled states, luring their sons to other states, and one section of the National Grange has advanced the theory that it will bring too much competition into the farming industry. Why not set the soldier up in some other business, it is said, as a grocer or a clothing merchant?

The purpose of the hearings before the house committee on public lands, conducted under Chairman Simeon, has been in large part to dispel distorted ideas about the bill. Several witnesses who came to oppose the bill have gone away with different ideas after they understood what it contained.

OPPOSITION SILENCED

One delegation representing New York farmers came to oppose special favors for "the arid lands of the West and the swamp lands of the South." Chairman Simeon explained that the bill provides for projects in all states where feasible projects may be found. He said that he had an official report published by the state of New York, showing an immense acreage of waste lands in New York. The delegation admitted that it seemed to cover their case.

Representative Boies of Iowa made a ringing speech against the bill. He protested that he would not aid the government to aid the returning soldier, and when pressed to state his plan, said he "would hand him as much money as the government thinks it can afford" should let him have from \$25 to \$50 a month for the months he was detained in the service.

TWO BILLION ASKED

The Boies idea of a gratuity to the soldiers, to those who do not need it as well as those who do, and with a certainty that a great deal of it would be spent quickly, as "retailers" usually are, would cost the government something like \$2,000,000,000, and would establish no one in productive industry.

As compared with that, the Lane-Mondell bill will cost the government nothing, for all the money will be returned in time, but will advance \$500,000 to men who want to "get a hold" and bring in no productive use. Estimating that \$5000 to \$6000 would be the investment for each farm, including advances for improvements and livestock, the number of farms provided will be from 80,000 to 100,000.

Congress probably will have little difficulty in choosing between these ideas, but there may be doubt as to whether it will limit the benefits to soldiers of the war with Germany. The veterans of other wars want to be included.

Those who believe in limiting it point out that this bill is framed with the idea that the country desires to do something in the way of special recognition to the men who in large number were drafted, and who have not had the same opportunity for taking desirable lands that the soldiers of the Civil war had under the homestead laws, and that even the men of the Spanish-American war have had under the reclamation law and what then remained of the public domain.

OBNOXIOUS CHANGE SOUGHT

Another amendment finding favor among some of the eastern and middle west delegations proposes to require expenditure of the money in each state in proportion to the state's contribution in men. This would make manpower the "and disorganize" the location of lands best suited for a location. The west would receive a pyramidal loan, while New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois and other states of large population would be deluged with more funds than could be properly expended.

The committee takes the position that while projects should be widely distributed, and every state that offers a good proposition should have one, discretion in the selection must be left to the secretary of the interior, so the government may be protected from undesirable schemes.
