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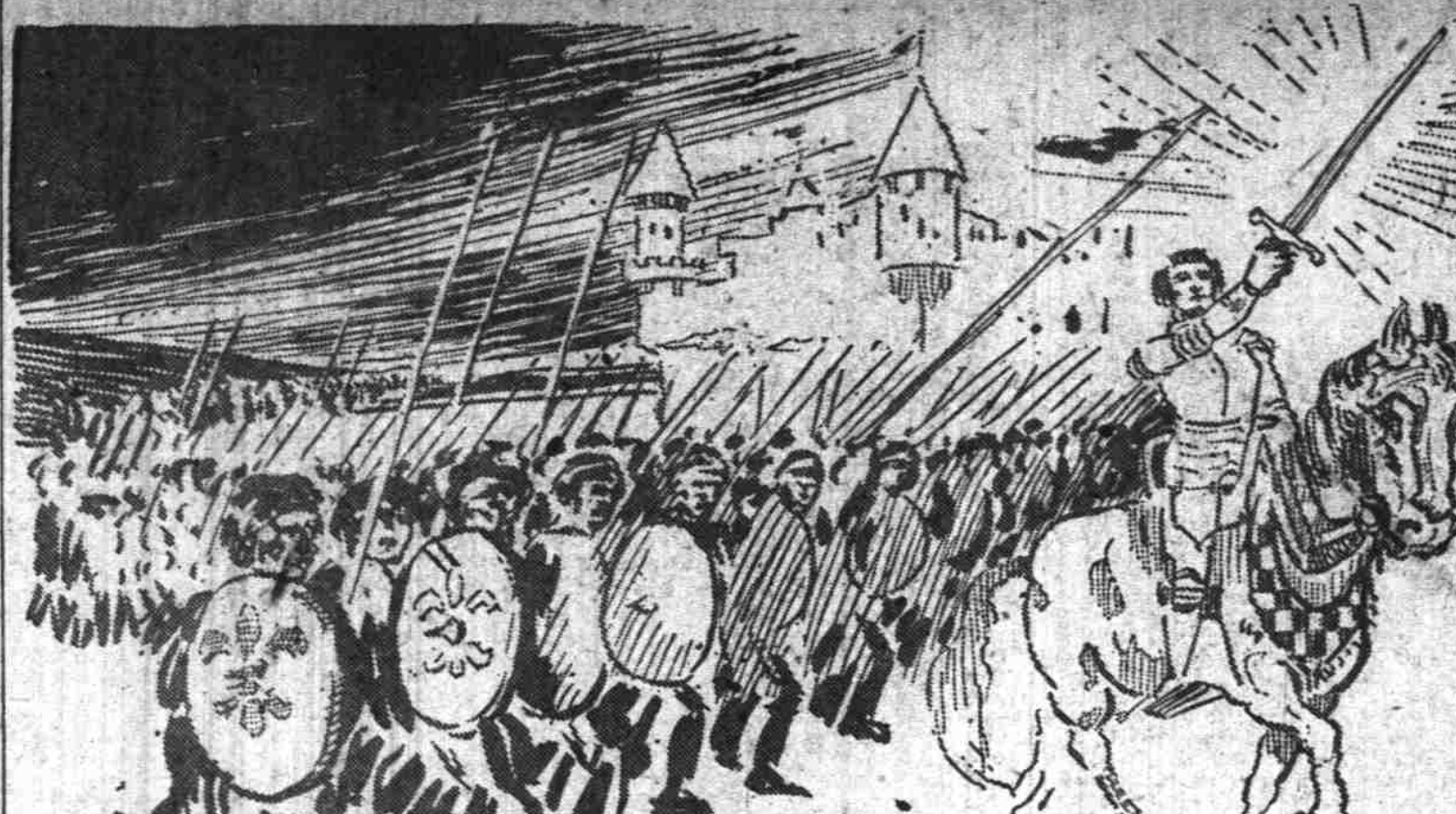
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Joan

Joan who rode before them on a charger bright as snow,

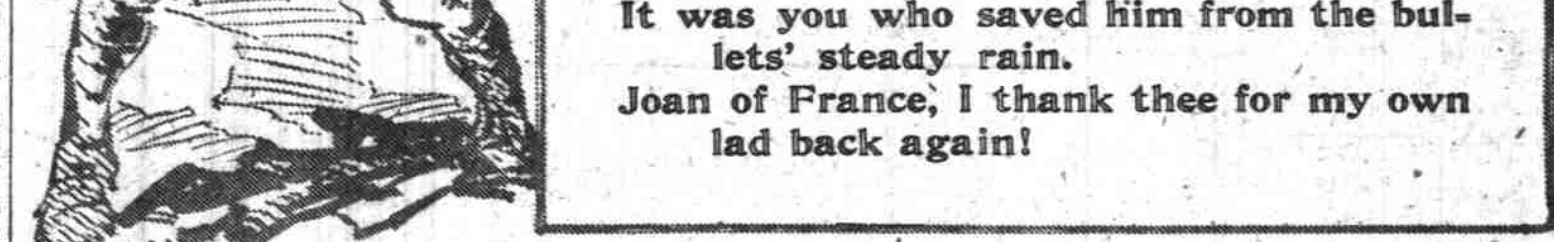
Your small foot in the stirrup, and a sword in that white hand,
