

RUPERT GLAD TO BE BACK IN PENITENTIARY AFTER SHORT LIBERTY

Love for Little Son, He Says, Is
Reason for Flight; Will Work
for Good Time.

Salem, July 16.—An intense love for his 7-year-old boy and an unconquerable desire to see him again led to the capture of Clyde J. (Red) Rupert, escaped Oregon convict, who Tuesday was returned to the Oregon state prison after four months of liberty.

Rupert admitted his weakness, if such it can be called, and tears filled his eyes at every mention of the boy, who is with his mother at Imperial Beach, Cal. It was through a letter addressed to the boy from Brawley, Cal., that officers picked up the trail that led to Rupert's capture and return to serve out the unexpired time of his three year term, with deductions for good time—and he declared he would earn that good time, too, every bit of it.

"I'm glad I'm back," he said. "It's impossible to beat the game. I've found it out and it was a real relief when I was picked up. I found out I could not see my boy while I was out. The danger of detection was too great. So I'm going to make the best of it and make it just as short as possible so that I can see him when I have done my time here and at McNeil's Island for the federal government."

Rupert emphatically denied that he was aided in his escape from the state time plant at Gold Hill when he made his break from the trusty gang on the evening of March 16.

"I went directly to Medford," he said, "running practically all the way. There I got in with a man who was shipping a trainload of cattle south. I helped him to load out and went with the train to Gaselle, Cal."

From Gaselle he paid his way to Sacramento and then to Upton, in the orange and lemon belt, where he worked in the orchards and packing sheds two months, going to Brawley about May 21, where he worked in the cantaloupe fields. It was his intention, he said, eventually to work his way into Mexico, and he was studiously picking up the Spanish language as he went, to that end.

He denied the report that he had been around Gresham a few days after his escape from Gold Hill, and has names and dates to account for every day while he was a fugitive.

Rupert was sentenced to from one to three years for the theft of \$15,500 in Liberty bonds from the Northwestern National Bank of Portland. He had served a year and 10 days—10 days in excess of his minimum, which entitled him to consideration for a parole—when he made his escape.

More Funds Cannot Be Provided for the Employment Bureau

"I endorse the request of the Portland Chamber of Commerce for an additional appropriation for employment service in the state of Oregon so that the women's division may remain."

"The very limited appropriations made available for the operation of the federal employment service renders it impossible to increase the allotment for Oregon."

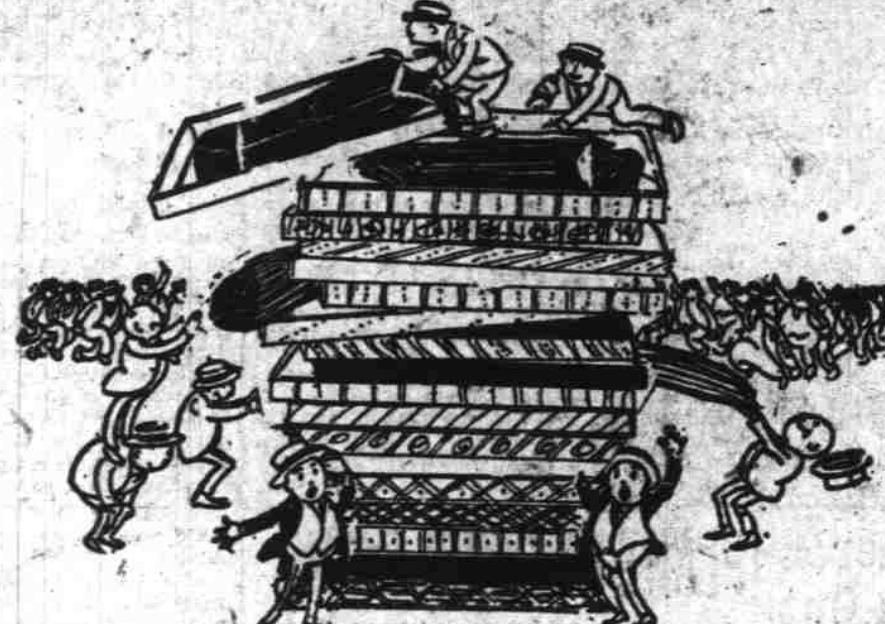
