

FIRE FIGHTERS IN MONTANA BATTLE TO STOP FLAMES

Dying Winds Help Men in Some Places, but Fires Spread On Unchecked Through Mountains

LANDERS FORK BLAZE HIGH

Fighters Charged With Lighting New Fires to Keep Work at High Wages in Emergency

Missoula, Mont., July 22.—A crew of 30 men was sent Monday to Supper and Forker to establish new camps from which to fight the Cold creek and Henderson fires, which are spreading over a large area in Western Montana, in spite of all efforts to stop them.

Another crew was sent to Landers fork, in the Helena forest, to fight a fire which has spread over 1200 acres and is threatening valuable timber.

This crew is directed by Captain C. O. K. one of the three fire fighters recently sent from District No. 2 at Denver.

INCENDIARISM SUSPECTED

Incendiarism is believed to be the cause of several new fires in the Bitter Root mountains, and an effort is being made to corral the men who are suspected of having set the woods ablaze in an effort to prolong their labor. Six men have already been convicted of fraud in this district. Having accepted government transportation and supplies, they refused to fight the fires on arrival and deserted.

The Swartz creek fire is under control on three sides, while the Battle snake fire is in good shape on all except the east side, where it is burning up the Cold creek timber.

The Elvado fire is still being kept within its former bounds, although a favorite sport of the population is to sit on the roofs surrounded with water in tubs and buckets to drown the cinch.

FIRES FOLLOW CREEKS

The Selway fires are rapidly becoming serious. One has burned over 20,000 acres and another over 5000 acres. The Coeur d'Alene has two fires, one on Bear creek being 350 acres in extent. It is thought the dangerous Steamboat creek blaze is under control.

The most serious fire in the Blackfoot district, which has four large blazes, the most dangerous being at Ashley lake, where 150 men are fighting the flames. The others are on Blue Sky creek, Tuckuck and Baldy mountain. High winds make the situation extremely precarious in that region.

New fires reported this afternoon were at Home State, in the Deer lodge forest, and on the continental divide in the Beaverhead forest.

FIFTY FIRE FIGHTERS ARE SENT OUT FROM PENDLETON

Pendleton, July 22.—Fifty men were sent out of Pendleton today to fight the forest fires raging in Whitman National forest, in the vicinity of the north fork of the John Day river.

R. M. Day, supervisor of the Whitman forest, passed through Pendleton from Baker, and will take charge. Forest fires are also reported to have broken out in the Umatilla National forest, in the region south of Heppner.

LUMBER CAMP NEAR BEND SAVED; FIRE IS CONTROLLED

Bend, July 22.—With more than 125 men fighting fire throughout Sunday night and part of Monday afternoon, they saved bunkhouses and machinery of the Shevlin-Hixon company at camp No. 1. The fire broke out shortly after noon Sunday, but was not discovered until late in the evening, when a big crew of men from the camp was rushed to combat it. The fire is now under control.

Dews Help Fighters

Spokane, Wash., July 22.—Heavy dew in the forests and absence of wind helped to help control the forest fires. The fires are practically stationary along the Idaho-Montana border, according to reports received late today.

4 Missing Girls Being Sought by Portland Police

Missing since early Monday morning, Lucille Freeman, 17, is sought through the aid of the police by Mrs. S. G. Lubliner, 214 North Nineteenth street, who reports that the girl, whose parents are supposed to live at Condon, came to her home from the state reform school. Lucille is 5 feet 4 inches tall, weighs 120 pounds, is of medium complexion and has brown hair and blue eyes. She wore a pink plaid house dress and white shoes and stockings when she disappeared.

Ruth R. Track, 16, has been missing since Sunday morning, her parents at 430 Jefferson street have reported to the police. She is said to be 5 feet 5 inches tall, weighing 122 pounds, with fair complexion, brown hair and blue eyes. She wore a ponce suit and black hat.

Last seen at 2 p. m. Sunday at the Oaks, Laura Green, 18, 167 East Twenty-ninth street, was reported to the police as missing on Monday morning. Elma Hoggard, employed as a maid at the Sellwood hospital, has not been seen since Friday night. A theory that she had been taken to a religious camp meeting over the week end has been abandoned.

No Clemency to Be Given Couple Jailed for Theft

"There will be no suspended sentences in this court," Judge R. G. Morrow, presiding judge of the circuit court, announced following his sentencing Monday of Willis Ireland and Hal Strauch, convicted on larceny charges. Both were told they deserved 10 lashes with the cat-o-nine-tails, Ireland got eight months and Strauch 93 days in the county jail.

Ireland, an army flyer from a California field, was in Portland on a 30 day leave. After over-staying his furlough, Ireland met a member of the military police, jumped into an automobile owned by F. C. Knapp, and started cross country to escape the "M. P." He was arrested in the stolen car at La Grande.

Louis Recken, the soldier's attorney, declared that Ireland was not responsible for his crime, inasmuch as he had been the subject of serum tests in the army, that had rendered him physically deficient.

Strauch was convicted of stealing an automobile on July 5.

Marshfield Boys Are Charged With Theft of Vintage

Marshfield, July 22.—John Goss, prominent Marshfield citizen, is mourning the loss of a valuable stock of wines as the result of a raid made on his home June 14 by four youths.

The word leaked at a hearing at which Wallace Goodman, 14-year-old son of Constable P. W. Goodman, was sent to the reform school, and Aubrey Nelsch, 22 years old, was bound over to the grand jury.

Lawrence Daniels, 19, who has been working in Portland was brought back to face charges in connection with the affair. The fourth in the party, George Van Leo, is missing.

The quartet, it is alleged, went to the Goss home in Nelsch's car, broke in while Goss was absent, drank some of the wine and made away with two full demijohns.

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RACIAL EQUALITY QUESTION WILL BE RAISED BY JAPAN

Issue to Be Taken Up at First Meeting of League of Nations, Envoy Alleged to Have Said.

VIEWS NEVER HAVE CHANGED

Japanese Will Resent Sherman's Speech; Believe Shantung Fight Was Merely Politics.

By John T. Parkinson. Paris, July 22.—(I. N. S.)—Japan intends to raise the issue of racial equality at the first meeting of the League of Nations, a member of the Japanese peace mission told the International News Service today.

"We have never changed our views on that point," he said. "If the United States senate makes certain reservations, affecting us, we will not reply by making reservations on the racial issue, as some have suggested, but we shall certainly raise the question later."

The Japanese peace delegate said he was uneasy over the effect in Japan of the present discussion about Shantung in the United States. The Japanese, he said, would resent Senator Sherman's speech as much as Americans would resent it if a Japanese statesman had trampled on their flag.

The Japanese mission is attempting to belittle the strength of the opposition in the United States to the Shantung award and to ascribe it entirely to political motives, he said, to prevent ill feeling in Japan against Americans.

It is becoming difficult, the Japanese diplomat admitted, and the Japanese people are inclined to believe that the whole American people are opposing the Shantung clause.

JAPANESE PAPER DENOUNCES U. S. AS SECOND GERMANY

San Francisco, July 22.—(U. P.)—"America's attitude toward Mexico is to be in every respect denounced, and America is instigating anti-Japanese agitation in various places. This attitude of America makes her a second Germany," declares the Yozoru Choho, an independent Japanese newspaper, received today from Tokyo.

"This fact, together with the concentration of a large fleet in the Pacific, deserves profound consideration by the Japanese," the article continues. "Senator Phelan has made a down-right anti-Japanese declaration in congress. He denounced the Japanese as the Germans of the Orient. Declaring that it could not be helped if Japan's feelings should be wounded in order to insure American peace, he urged absolute prohibition of Japanese immigration."

This is only Mr. Phelan's opinion, but it is difficult to understand why it is intended to injure Japan's feelings by such a statement while Japan is faithfully observing the gentlemen's agreement. The recent attitude of the United States is

entirely contrary to the spirit of the League of Nations and is causing ill feeling among the various people of the world."

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ARRESTS RESULT OF AIR TRAGEDY

disaster is that the city council will draft and pass ordinance regulating future traffic over the city by aircraft of all description.

The coroner's inquest is scheduled to get under way today but may be deferred until all witnesses are located. Eighteen, most of them employees of the Goodyear Tire & Rubber company of Akron, Ohio, who owned the ill-fated blimp, are being held as witnesses.

A squad of workmen early today cleared away the crashed down upon it debris left by the flaming blimp as it crashed through the skylight of the bank. The interior of the bank, called by architects a perfect specimen of Grecian art, revealed today a hideous aftermath of the tragedy.

BANK COMPLETELY WRECKED

There were traces of where bodies, torn and mangled, had been taken up bit by bit and carried to morgues to await identification. Outside the bank a curious throng gathered as the big financial institution prepared to open for business despite the fact that its counting room could scarcely have been more completely wrecked had a shell from a giant gun crashed down upon it.

Of the 12 killed in the disaster five were girls, employed as clerks or stenographers in the bank. Four other employees of the bank lost their lives. Carl Weaver, mechanic, and Earl Davenport, a publicity man, were two passengers aboard the blimp who were killed. All of the victims except Weaver, who came from Akron, Ohio, were residents of Chicago.

CAUSE OF TRAGEDY UNSOLVED

The cause of the tragedy as yet remains a mystery. The coroner's investigation, is unable to advance any logical explanation. One theory is that dripping oil from the motors may have ignited the gas bag; another is that sparks from the propeller may have leaped to the bag as gas was being valved in, while the theory that friction
