EDUCATION WITHIN REACH OF EVERY AMBITIOUS PERSON

Statistics Show 77 Per Cent of Students at O. A. C. Are Wholly or Partly Self Supporting.

GRIT IS ALL THAT IS NEEDED

Plenty of Determination Combined With Sound Mind and Body Is All That Is Required.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, July 26.—A college education is within reach of any bright, ambitious young man or woman, statistics show. It isn't necessary to be a rich man's son or daughter nowadays to get the kind of training which fits one for service and leadership in his community. All that is necessary is a sound mind and body and plenty of determination. That 77 per cent of the students of the Oregon Agricultural college are either entirely or partly self-supporting is shown by records in the office of H. M. Tenant, registrar. Thirty-nine per cent are entirely self-supporting, 11 per cent less than half, and 25 per cent not at all. Students find nearly a thousand and one ways of earning money to defray college expenses.

WHAT CHARGES ARE
General expenses are listed as follows: Registration fee, \$5; incidental student fee, \$10; gymnasium fee, \$3; laboratory fees and deposits, \$24; board and room for eight months, \$160 to \$250; room rent for nine months, \$24. Cost of education is estimated for eight months only on account of Christmas and other vacations which most students spend at home.

By far the largest single item is that for board and room. Personal expenses such as clothing and laundry vary greatly with the individual. The incidental or student body fee entitles the student to the student body paper, the O. A. C. Barometer, free admission to the student activities such as athletic contests, oratory and debate, band and glee club, and also free access to the college health service.

Personal expense is considered largely a question of thrift, discrimination in values and established habits. Men in the R. O. T. C. obtain their military uniforms from the government without cost to themselves. All men are expected to provide themselves with gymnasium suits, including shoes, costing approximately \$2.75. In physical education women are required to provide themselves with gymnasium suits.

LIVING CONDITIONS GOOD
Waldo and Cauthorn halls, with large airy parlors and halls, furnish pleasant residence for the young women who come from distant homes. The buildings are supplied with pure mountain water, both hot and cold, electric lights, steam heat, and all modern conveniences. Conditions of living in these halls are such that the management considers it a distinct advantage for the women students to live in them. A wholesome, busy student atmosphere is maintained. Reasonable freedom is al-

lowed, but week nights are reserved for study.

Expense of living for each student in the dormitory is as follows: Room deposit, \$5; room rent per term for single room \$15, double room \$9; board per week, payable monthly in advance, \$4.50; incidentals, such as laundry and electric iron fees, \$2.

No dormitory accommodations are available for men students, but board and room may be had in private family for from \$4.50 to \$7.50 per week. Good accommodations for self boarding or club boarding can be obtained. By clubbing or renting rooms and boarding themselves, the students greatly reduce the cost of living. Students are not permitted to live, however, in places not approved by the faculty.

CHANCE TO EARN MONEY
The student employment bureau for men in charge of the Y. M. C. A., and the student employment bureau for women, in charge of the dean of women, register without charge all students who apply for employment. It is the purpose of the bureau to try to supply work, regular or occasional, to all who need it.

Many opportunities for earning the living expenses are open to students in the line of office and laboratory assistance, personal services of numerous kinds, management of various student enterprises, and agencies for laundry, cleaning, and other services in dining rooms of residence halls, in cleaning these halls, in dressmaking, and in many other ways, some of them original. One enterprising young lady took in considerable money through shining shoes at 5 cents a shine.

A loan fund amounting to between \$7000 and \$8000, the gift of friends of the college, is available for loans to needy and worthy students, in amounts varying from \$50 to \$150. In addition to this general fund there are two special funds known respectively as the L. J. Simpson scholarship loan fund, and the J. T. Apperson agricultural college educational fund.

SCOLARSHIP LOANS
The former provides five annual scholarship loans of \$1000 each continuing through the four years of the student's college course, while the latter provides for loans to students resident in Oregon, the amounts and the number of loans varying with conditions. Loans draw interest at the rate of 4 per cent per annum. Applications for loans are made to the chairman of the student loan fund committee, after the student registers at the college.

The Clara H. Waldo prize of \$100 is an award annually made in the proportions of \$40, \$30, \$20 and \$10, to the woman of highest standing registered as a regular student in one of the degree courses in the senior, junior, sophomore, and freshman year. The A. J. Johnson prize of \$149 is announced beginning with the college year 1919-20 to be awarded in the proportions of \$50, \$40, \$30, and \$29, to the man of highest standing registered as a regular student in one of the degree courses in the senior, junior, sophomore and freshman classes.

SUBJECTS TAUGHT AT U. OF O. ARE HIGHLY PRACTICAL

University Has Taken Nothing From Classical Courses, but Is Prepared for Other Demands.

GRADUATES ARE PROSPERING

University of Oregon, Eugene, July 26.—Occasionally some one is still found whose idea of a university is restricted to the old liberal-arts college, which ran heavily to Latin and Greek and languages and was light on the practical subjects which aid directly in making one's living.

While the University of Oregon has sought to take nothing from the strength of its classical departments, it is in every way better prepared than ever to comply with the growing demand for practical training along technical lines. The various technical schools are showing a constantly accelerating growth in both in training effectiveness and in numbers of students.

The facilities in all these various schools are considered stronger than ever; better prepared to give thoroughly adequate preparation for a start in these various professions.

TURNING OUT SPECIALISTS
Realizing that the strength of the state will depend, to a considerable degree, on its trained experts and professional men, the university is trying, more and more, to turn out an adequate supply of specialists. Not only the technical schools, but the various scientific courses, including physics, chemistry, geology, botany, bacteriology, and training experts who are winning recognition in their respective lines. The sojourn courses on the campus are considered thoroughly adequate for pre-medical training, after which the student is ready to take his medical course.

GRADUATE WORK ENCOURAGING
Graduate work in the various sciences is more and more encouraged. An additional \$5000 made available this year is being devoted to scholarships, under which a limited number of advance students may devote half their time to teaching and laboratory assisting and the other half to advanced research, receiving for their services enough to carry them through.

More and more the University of Oregon is seeking to be recognized as a place where the student may fit himself for immediate entrance into a widening number of professions; its practical value is not sacrificed for cultural development. On the other hand, it is the aim of faculties in all the schools and departments to develop the

Architect Making Plans for Women's Hall at Willamette

Plans are being prepared by Architect Legg for the Lausanne hall, which will accommodate 125 young women. Until this building is completed the young women will room and board in groups convenient to the campus. More than half of the money for this needed dormitory is pledged.

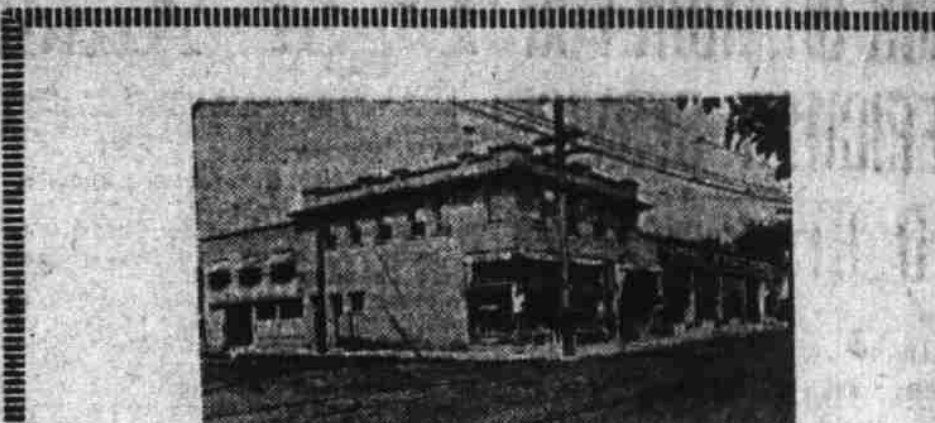
