

MANIAC BELIEVED SLAYER OF YOUNG GIRL NEAR BANDON

Motive for the Murder of Lillian Leuthold Lacking; Physicians Set Aside Theory of Assault.

HUNT IS MADE FOR TRAMP

Clothing May Have Been Torn as Body Is Dragged From Road; Bullet Wounds Only Violence.

Marshfield, July 30.—That an insane person may have killed Lillian Leuthold, 16-year-old daughter of John Leuthold, near Bandon, is a theory held by authorities. When the body was found Sunday evening in the bushes near an unfrequented road through which the girl passed on her way home from a visit to her chum, daughter of the Rev. Jennings, the torn condition of the clothing led to the belief that the murderer had attempted an assault. The doctors dismiss this theory.

The condition of the clothing is now believed due to the fact that the body had been dragged by the feet from the road into the brush a short distance away. It was the girl's clothing that was scattered from the road to where the body was found, marking a trail and indicating that the murderer hurried away without attempting to remove traces of the crime.

Further than the two pistol shot wounds in the head there were no marks of violence. A third, which a coroner Wilson held an inquest. Friends and schoolmates of the girl testified that she was demure and timid, and had no boy lovers that they knew of. A bullet has been recovered from the body.

A bed made of boughs and canvas was found near the scene of the crime. A stranger, probably a tramp, was seen sleeping there last Thursday night and was seen in the neighborhood Saturday. He has not been seen since the murder and searches for him have been fruitless. Descriptions of him are indefinite.

The girl did not carry any money and two rings which she wore were not removed from her fingers, which tends to show robbery was not the motive. There is an unsupported rumor that a woman is suspected. The murder apparently lacked motive and therefore baffles investigators.

Sister Pleads in Vain for Chance to Reform Brother

In spite of pleas of his sister that she would care for him and see that he went out into the country to try to recover, William Boatwright, convicted Saturday for charges of vagrancy, was sentenced to four months in the city jail by Judge Roseman Tuesday afternoon. Boatwright was arrested by Officers Goss and Howell several days ago. A quantity of stolen goods was found in his possession, it is alleged, and he was identified by finger prints as the same man who had faced similar charges several times before. Police officials state that he has a record in Seattle and Victoria, B. C., and allege that he is addicted to the use of drugs.

In begging for her brother's release, his sister told the judge that William had been bitten by a dog in his youth and that his leg had been broken. As a result of these injuries he was forced to take an opiate, and had formed the drug habit, she said.

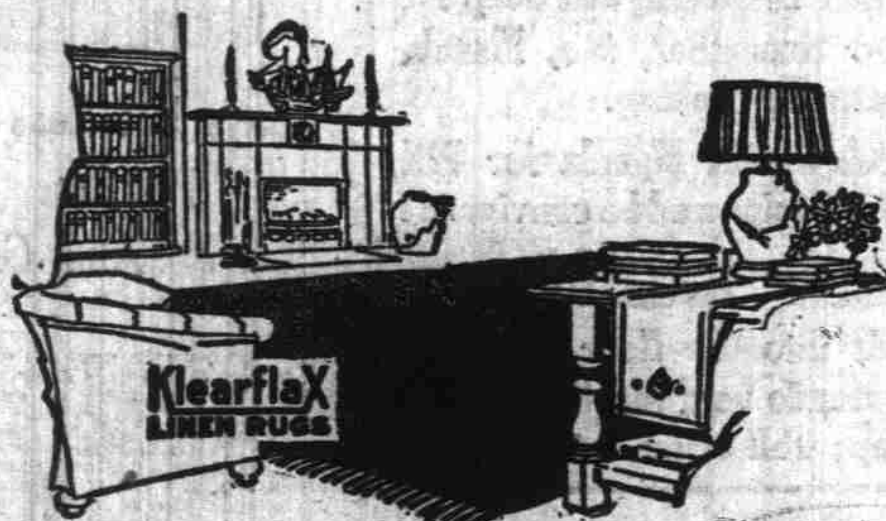

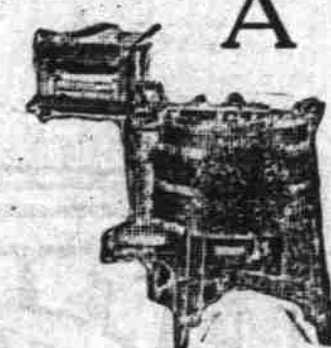
