

DENMAN PREPARES TO OPERATE MILL

C. A. Smith Plant Will Resume Operations Soon; Will Be Sold Dec. 1 to Satisfy Claim.

Marshfield, Aug. 7.—Receiver Denman of the C. A. Smith company is on Coos Bay to look over company property, and prepare to start operations soon. The receivers may order that the whole property under a lease. To satisfy the mortgage the property will be offered for sale December 1 and then there is another year in which Smith can redeem.

About 600 more men will be required at the mill and camp. Some of the camps are now operating and the east side mill of the company is running night and day under the direction of the receivers but the big mill is idle. Hundreds of men are now engaged in road work, but this labor will stop after the first fall rain which will release many. It is expected that many men formerly connected with the Smith company will return to their old places.

The receivers will immediately begin work repairing the boilers at the mill and doing other road work, and in the meantime will be looking into the labor situation. It is hoped, however, Denman says, that there will be sufficient men to operate the mill, though it may be some weeks before the actual manufacture of lumber can start.

O. A. C. Graduates Make Success of Work in Big Plant

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Aug. 7.—R. H. Denborn, professor of electrical engineering at the college, has returned from an extended trip to the East. He attended the annual meeting of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers at Lake Placid, N. Y., and the meeting of the Society for the Promotion of Engineering Education at Baltimore, and visited the General Electric, Westinghouse and many big power plants, including that at Keokuk, Iowa. At the General Electric plant at Schenectady, he saw several graduates of the college, who have made successes of their work.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Aug. 7.—Miss Ethel Taylor, a graduate of the University of Michigan in 1906, who has had 18 years of teaching experience and is now connected with the Western Reserve academy of Ohio, has been appointed as instructor in the department of modern languages of the college. Another addition to the department is E. E. Williams, a graduate of the University of Chicago, who has been teaching Spanish in a Detroit, Mich., high school.

Polk Legislator in Flight Over Oregon Towns 7000 Feet Up

Dallas, Aug. 7.—W. V. Fuller, representative in the state legislature from Polk county and supervising fire warden for this county, took his initial trip in an airplane Monday, in one of the army planes assigned to fire patrol duty in Oregon, piloted by Lieutenant Kiel. They left Salem in the morning, passing over Silverton, without Springs and Molalla at an altitude of 7000 feet, going as far east as Mount Hood, when they turned toward Portland, arriving there 78 minutes after they left Salem.

Sale of Poor Farm Is Being Considered

Disposition of the old county poor farm on the Canyon road is being considered by the Multnomah county commissioners. The property consists of 202 acres and has been estimated as having a value of approximately \$10,000. The land is located at the edge of the city park, close to the city limits, and the commissioners are debating the advisability of turning it over to the city for park purposes or offering it for sale.

Some O-W Shopmen In Washington Join Ranks of Strikers

37 New Portable School Buildings Rising in Portland

Thirty-seven new portable school buildings, involving \$75,000 in cost, are springing up over the city, most of which will be ready for occupancy at the opening of school, September 2. Some of the buildings are already complete. The portables are being erected in lieu of the new school buildings, bonds for which failed in the recent election.

While the title is just now being obtained to the Dixon property, the lumber and other materials are already on the grounds and work will commence at once. School Clerk Thomas is having considerable trouble obtaining labor necessary to hurry up the construction.

Whiskey Sale Case Brings Appeal Fight

New York, Aug. 7.—The first conviction for selling whiskey after July 1 will be made the subject of an appeal fight to test the constitutionality of the statute, it was said here today. John H. Voegel, a Center street saloon-keeper, was fined \$1000 and sentenced to six months' imprisonment by Federal Judge Wilson, for selling a drink of whiskey across his bar on July 2. A stay of 10 days was granted for an appeal.

DROUGHT IN VICINITY OF UNION IS BROKEN BY SUNDAY RAINFALL

Despite Dryness of Season Crops Are Generally Good; Wheat on Hill Land Heavy.

Eastern Oregon Experiment Station, Union, Aug. 7.—The drought was broken in this vicinity Sunday, when .08 of an

inch of rain fell, the first rain for 36 days and the largest amount of rain since May 25, according to weather observations taken here. Since April 1 there has been less than 1.5 inches of rain and the total precipitation since January 1 amounts to but 4.5 inches. There was less rain this year than last, though the rainfall of last year was below normal. From January 1 to August 1 last year the total precipitation was 6.5 inches, while during the same period this year it was but 4.4 inches. During July this year there was no rain while last year there was 1.6 inches. During June and July this year, the months when rain is needed, there was but .11 of an inch of rain. Last year during the same months there was 1.63 inches and the average rainfall for the months of June and July during years 1914, 1915 and 1916 was 2.81 inches. The average annual precipitation in

this section for the last five years was 13.85 inches. In spite of the scarcity of rain the crops in this vicinity are generally good. The spring crops on the hill lands have been affected somewhat by the drought, much more than have those on the bottom lands. The fall crops, though, even on the hill lands are turning out well, much better than was expected a few weeks ago. On the Charles Playle ranch near Union Forty-fold wheat has been harvested which yielded more than 30 bushels to the acre on hill land.
