

HIGH SCHOOLS COME WITHIN EDUCATIONAL AID LAW'S PROVISIONS

Recognition Is Given Nearly 200 Preparatory Institutions Without Formality.

Salem, Aug. 8.—All established high schools within the state, of which there are nearly 200, are receiving blanks for the use of ex-service men in applying for state aid under the provisions of the soldiers' educational aid law. Established high schools are recognized as coming within the provisions of the act without the necessity of making any further showing.

With the supply of blanks, which are being sent out by Sam A. Koser, deputy secretary of state, there are also being sent copies of the law and the opinions of Attorney General Brown construing its provisions. In connection with an explanation of the provisions of the act Mr. Koser issued the following statement:

"Applications must be made directly to the head of the institution of learning, whether public or private, in which applicants desire to pursue a course of study, and, in order to secure information regarding its requirements and benefits, they should address their requests or make their inquiries of the head of the institution which they desire to attend. By following a course of this kind, they will undoubtedly save themselves much delay.

The benefits of this law are not paid directly by the state to the soldier, sailor or marine. At the end of each month he is required to render a statement of his expenditures during that period to the executive head of the institution which he is attending. That individual renders a statement to the secretary of state of the monthly amounts which are certified to him by those attending his institution and receiving the benefits of the financial educational aid law, which is audited the same as other claims against the state. The head of this institution is responsible for the money of the soldier, sailor or marine, who must look to the head of the institution he is attending for the assistance to which he is entitled under the law."

A. OLNSTED APPOINTED TO MINES AND GEOLOGY BUREAU
 Salem, Aug. 8.—F. A. Olmsted of Portland has been appointed by Governor Olcott to succeed H. N. Lawrie, resigned, as a member of the Oregon bureau of mines and geology. Lawrie, who served for seven years as chairman of the bureau, is now in Washington, D. C., as chairman of the division of precious and rare metals of the American Mining congress.

Olmsted was for many years chemical engineer for the Crown Willamette Paper company and for four or five years has been a consulting chemical and industrial engineer in Portland.

LUMBER MILL AND EXPORT COMPANY IS INCORPORATED
 Salem, Aug. 8.—Capitalized at \$100,000, the International Lumber Mill & Export company of Portland filed articles of incorporation with the corporation department here Thursday. The incorporators are: C. A. Schoolmaster, Arthur Cook and A. C. Emmons. The Workmen's club of Portland filed a certificate showing an increase in its capital stock from \$5000 to \$20,000.

Construction of 'New Bridge Over Chehalis Started

Centralia, Wash., Aug. 8.—Construction of a new bridge over the Chehalis river at Adna has been started. The structure will be 220 feet in length, with steel spans and concrete piers and will cost \$32,000, of which the federal government will pay half and the county half. There will be 600 feet of trestle approach to the bridge.

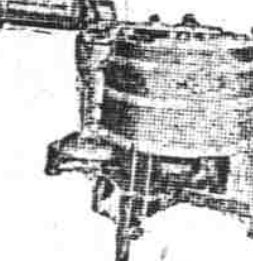

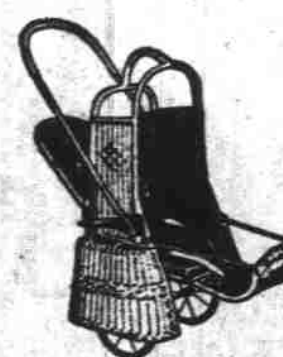
