Restoration of devastated Protestant churches in the war zone will be pushed at once with vigor by the Presbyterlan church in the U. S. A., according to plans just perfected at Presbyterian headquarters, 156 Fifth avenue, New York city, said Dr. William Hiram Foulkes, general secretary of the Presbyterian New Era movement, in announcing complete

Five hundred thousand dollars will be spent this year in this cause. Of this, about one-half is to be spent among countries, the money to be spent directly by the agencies themselves, for the sal-aries and equipment of pastors, for the training and care of students for the Gospel ministry, for the rebuilding of churches and manses, for the support of schools and theological institutions divarious evangelical Protestant

An immediate survey will be made of the needs of these Protestant churches, Three conference periods beginning at preliminary to quick action in the disalready been pledged. This relief work is to be conducted with a minimum of adminis trative expense, as the chairman, treas urer and secretary of the Presbyterian General Assembly's committee in charge of the work will serve without compen-sation.
