Washington, D. C., Aug. 13 .-WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)-One of the most powerful arguments dealing with the treaty making power as applied to the League of Nations, and refuting old guard contentions that the constitution is in the way of the League of Nations was made by Senator Kellogg of Minnesota, Republican. Kellogg is one of the best qualified students of constitutional law in the senate, and his remarks, fortified by voluminous quotations from eminent authorities, received marked attention from both sides of the senate. 
