

PORTLAND ASKED TO CONTRIBUTE TOWARD FUNDS FOR FRENCH

Local Clubs Will Direct Campaign for Collections for Women and Children.

To aid the helpless women and children of France a fund will be raised in Portland through the cooperation and activity of the Portland club, the Rotary club, the Kiwanis club and the Oregon Civic league.

This announcement was made in the form of a challenge by W. P. Stranborg, who has been appointed chairman for Oregon, and the fund will be given to the American women's hospital service in France, which is now extending its work into Serbia. Through some oversight, the call for the support of this work was not made public until Wednesday and Oregon, which has given so generously to every other fund of this nature, has not yet given anything to the American women's hospital service abroad. The plan is to see which of the clubs in the contest will be able to raise \$1000 for the fund, and as Oregon's quota is \$5000 the work will not be of long duration. Voluntary subscriptions made at the Ad club luncheon on Wednesday amounted to \$125, but the active drive does not begin until next Wednesday.

The work of the women's hospital service in France includes about 200 hospitals and dispensaries in France and a number in Serbia, and because of the neglect which the women and children suffered during the war period the need is now more urgent.

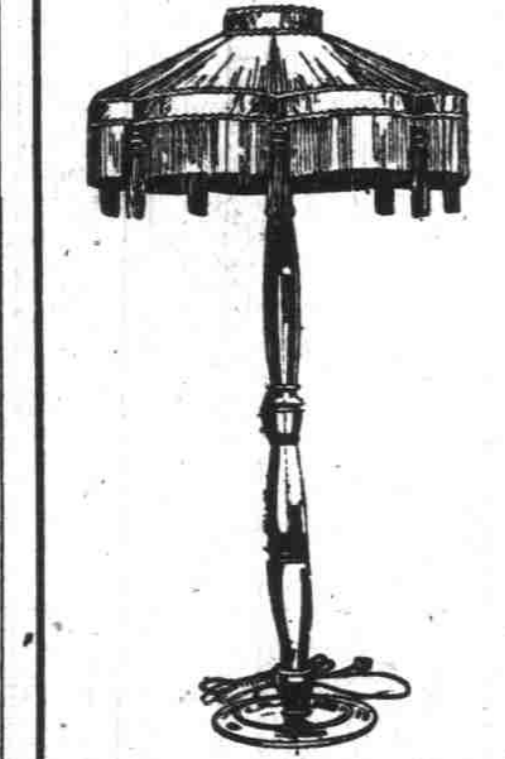
