

AGRICULTURAL AND WAR EXHIBITS FOR FAIR TO BE LARGE

Everything Being Rapidly Put Into Readiness for State Demonstration at Salem.

Salem, Aug. 28.—In announcing today that all arrangements have been completed for showing the huge government agricultural and war exhibits, A. H. Lee, secretary of the state fair board, said that the agricultural exhibit of the coming state fair would be the "greatest and most instructive" ever shown in the history of the Oregon fair.

"Both the government agricultural and war exhibits will be shown in the educational pavilion, and each exhibit will occupy 4000 feet of floor space," continued the secretary. "Each will be accompanied by expert lecturers and demonstrators. These two exhibits alone will be well worth a trip to the fair."

MORE COUNTIES THAN EVER
"More counties than ever before have signified their intentions of being represented by agricultural exhibits, and present indications are that they will be unusually attractive. Twenty-five have already applied for booths, and every bit of available space on the lower floor of the agricultural pavilion will be occupied this year with county agricultural exhibits. The record for previous years has been 18 counties, making an increase of at least seven for this year."

"The livestock show bids fair to surpass similar exhibitions of previous years. For the first time the big stock farms of the Middle West will be represented by herds."

CANADA TO HAVE EXHIBIT

"Canada will have on display a considerable number of cattle, and California horsemen are evincing much interest in the fair than heretofore. Eastern Oregon will send a whole trainload of livestock to the fair, and the big breeders of the Willamette valley and Washington will be on hand with the best of their cattle and horses."

"The automobile and tractor shows will be immense, and there will be a tremendous amount of machinery on display. Practical demonstrations will be given each day by exhibitors of tractors and machinery."

The fair will open Monday, September 22, and will last for a week.

McNary Wires Plane Bases Were Intended For Roseburg, Salem

No authorization had been made for moving the former military base from Roseburg to Eugene, according to a telegram from Senator McNary received late Wednesday afternoon, which follows:

"To Carl E. Wimbler: Colonel Pratt, executive officer for major general, advised me that in accordance with a promise previously given, he had wired the department of air service at San Francisco to maintain the bases at Salem and Roseburg. He does not understand the cause for changing the base which you report. He is wiring Colonel Arnold, western department of the air service, to find out the reason for the change. Unless an important reason is advanced, stations will be maintained at Salem and Roseburg as before. Charles L. McNary, United States senator."

A fleet of seven planes, Major Smith in charge, departed for Salem at 6 o'clock. The major knows no reason for moving the base. He merely followed orders.

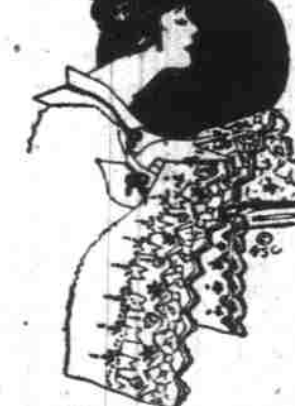
