HEILIG—The first public showing in this city of the picture "The End of the Road," starring Richard Bennett and Claire Adams, takes place next Wednesday night at 7 p. m. at the Heilig theatre, where continuous performances will be given three days, from 1 until 11 o'clock. The picture takes nearly two hours to project. This picture was prepared as part of the campaign to combat avoidable sex diseases. It handles certain social and sex problems in their relation to women with a frank statement which is a direct consequence of a new attitude engendered by recent events which have disturbed the emotional equilibrium of the people and have tended to multiply the intricacies of sex relations.

The film is intended to stimulate and strengthen the efforts being made to teach the womanhood and girlhood of our country the vital need of right social adjustment.

Every foot of "The End of the Road" is said to be filled with human interest, graphically pictured. Into the main story have been woven supplementary

stories and incidents each drawn from actual life by the author of the story, Dr. Katherine Bement Davis, who was formerly commissioner of correction of New York city, and who is one of the best informed women on the subject. Inasmuch as one of the most terrible and socially vital results of sexual misconduct is infection, this has been advisedly stressed, though not accentuated. Throughout the effort has been to make disease appear to be, as it actually is in life, the often inevitable price of loose living, ignorance, thoughtlessness and irresponsibility. Supporting Mr. Bennett and Miss Adams is an excellent cast including Ray McKee, Joyce Fair and others.
