

MOTOR SHOW AT STATE FAIR WILL BE ONE OF BEST

Dealers Are Primed to Put on Something to Make Eyes of Beholder Light With Pleasure.

AUTO RACES TO BE FEATURE

Special Machines and Drivers Who Make Racing Business Will Be in Contest at Salem.

"The state fair this year, from a motor standpoint alone, will be the best one that has been held in many years, and the best yet in a good many ways," said M. O. Wilkins, president of the Dealers' Motor Car association of Oregon, in speaking of the automobile show to be held in the capital city.

"Last year we went down more to keep in line than to stage a real campaign for the motor car, but this year dealers are going down primed to put on something that will make the eyes of the beholder light with pleasure. The building is much larger than the one formerly used, having hardwood floors, and containing 25,000 square feet of floor space. Last year we were in trepidation all the time lest fire start from matches and smoking materials being thrown in the sawdust. There will be no worry on that score this year.

MUCH TO INTEREST

"There are a number of new cars in the field this fair week that have hitherto been strangers to the local territory. The Cleveland, Jones, Monitor, Anderson, Stephens, new Overland and new Reo are new models to fair habitués, and will create a great deal of interest. The trucks will be equipped with pneumatic tires, something that has not been attempted to any great extent heretofore.

"The building will be decorated on the outside with pennants showing the cars on exhibition. Little or no advertising will be permitted. Cars may have pennants on them, and a green banner showing the name of the firm to whom the exhibit belongs will be displayed conspicuously over the stall. Easels will be used for the display of photographs, provided they are not over 4 feet high. Tables will be provided for the display of parts and accessories.

SPICK AND SPAN

All cars will be washed and in spick and span condition. This rule is made to cover those, and their name is legion, who will have their exhibit cars to the scene of the display. Last year the Salem fire department assisted in this work.

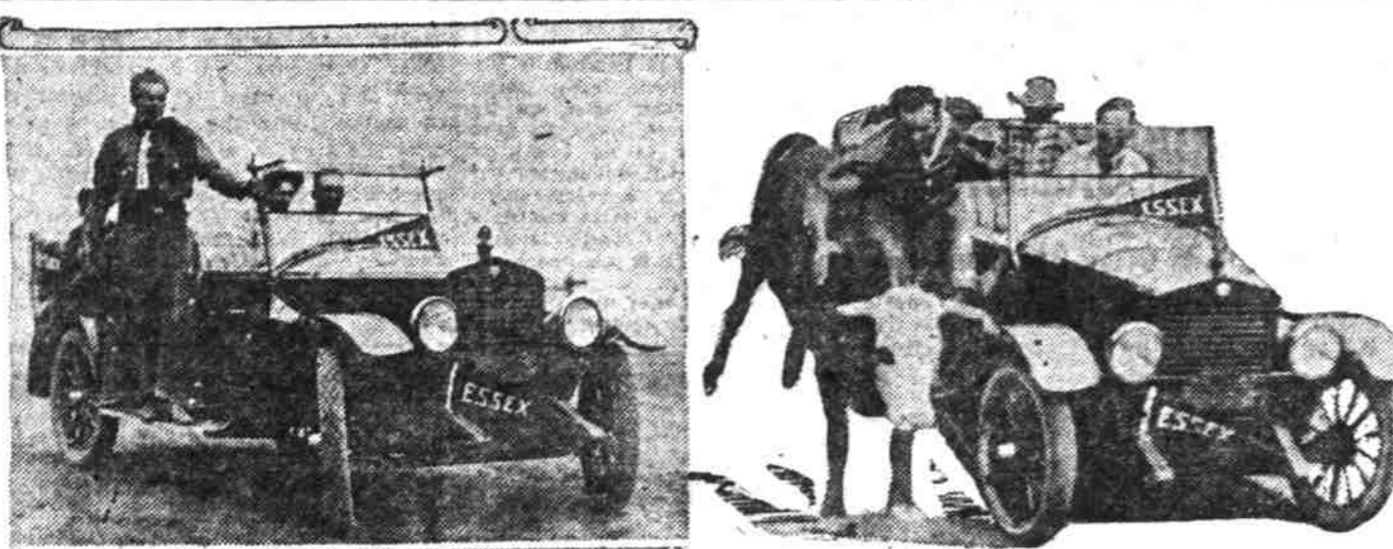
"The auto races will be a feature this year. They will be staged on the last day of the fair, Saturday, and will not be tame stock model affairs, but tilts between specialists driven by men who make a business of driving.

"Taking everything into consideration, we are looking forward to a great week down there in the valley, and the motorist who fails to attend for one day at least will have missed something very much worth while."

Autos Number Almost 80,000 September Increase Is Large

Salem, Sept. 20.—Since September 1, 1907 motor vehicle licenses have been issued by the secretary of state, which represent mostly new cars purchased and registered since that date, and is in excess of 250 for the same period during the year 1918, during which only 750 cars were registered.

Total registrations of automobiles at the close of business September 15 numbered 73,310, motorcycles 3166, dealers' and chauffeurs' 2870. The total number of automobiles and motorcycles which have been transferred since January 1 total 11,400. The total fees received from all transactions of the department aggregate \$52,352, which is more than \$120,000 in excess of the receipts from all sources for the entire year 1918. This entire sum, less administrative expenses, has been turned over to the state treasurer, who credits the same to the state highway fund for road construction and road improvement throughout the entire state, under the direction of the state highway commission. In the year 1918, there were 63,225 cars registered.
