MOUNT HOOD, the premier peak of Oregon, rears its majestic snow-mantled summit over the Cascade range, at a point more than 60 miles east of Portland. Its summit, 12,225 feet above sea level, which is the goal of an increasing number of mountain climbers, can be reached from the north side via Hood River, and the south side via Government Camp. The construction of an improved highway around the east base of the mountain, connecting the roads on the north and south, is an assured project for the immediate future.
