Irving dock, on the east side just below the Broadway bridge, is to be repaired. The dock has been considered as unsafe for some time because of the condition of the foundation.

The piling is to be cut off at the low water line and a grillage of heavy beams will be laid on top. From this grillage heavy posts will be carried up to the floor system and braced.

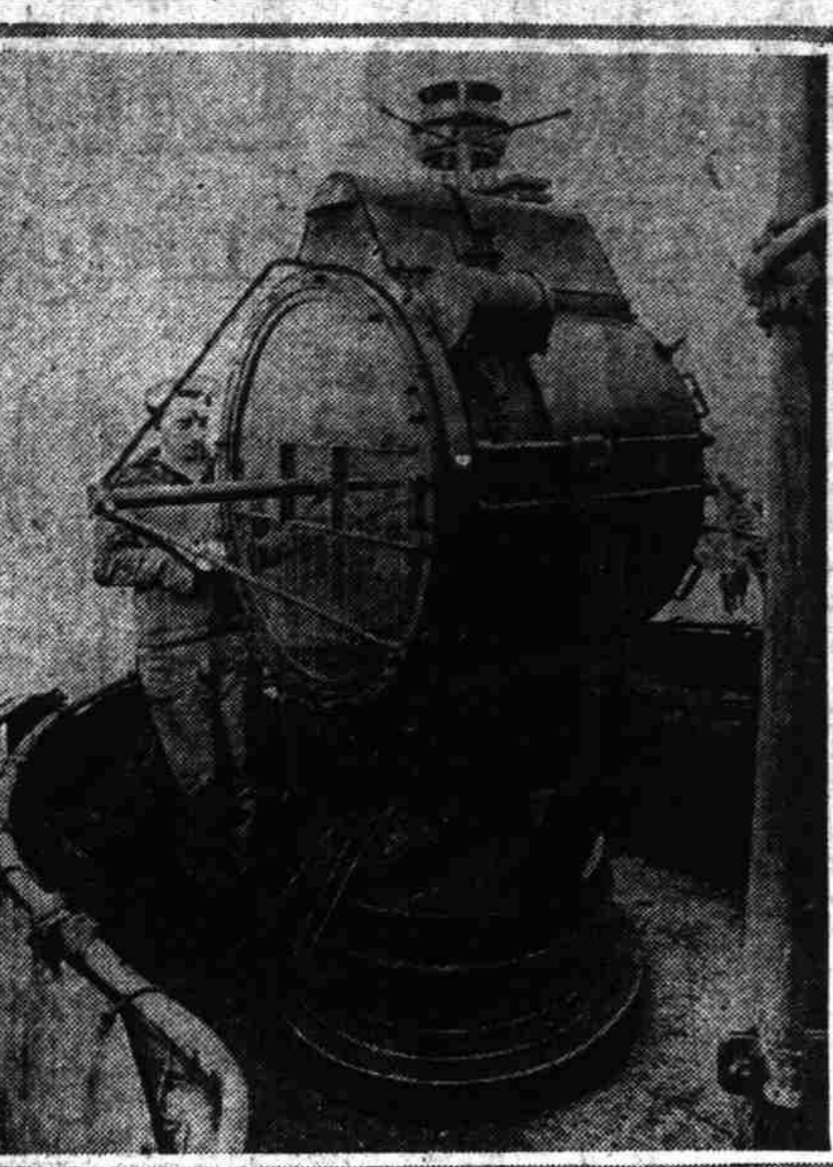
