PRESBYTERIAN **PULPITS SHOW MANY CHANGES**

Return of Number of Ministers From War Work Causes General Rearrangement in State.

TWO ARE WITHOUT PASTORS

First Church and Central, While in Numerous Cases New Faces Are to Be Seen by Members.

Return of a large number of ministers from war work to pastoral work has caused a general rearrangement of clergymen throughout the state. This is particularly true of the Presbyterian churches in Portland, few of which have the same pastor now as they had at the beginning of the world struggle. A large number of ministers have arrived in Oregon, or are soon due here, to assume charge of various pastorates. The First and Central Presbyterian churches of Portland are still without pastors.


