Every English Student in High
Schools to Have a Chance to
Compete for Five Prizes.

TO GO TO MRS. ROOSEVELT

Winning Themes Will Be Sent to
Oyster Bay After Publication
in Portland Newspapers.

Instructions issued by School Su-
perintendent D. A. Grout will place
the educational feature of the Roose-
velt Memorial association campaign
before every pupil in every school in
the city.

Under these instructions, every pupil
will write an essay on "What the Life
of Theodore Roosevelt Means to Me" as
a part of their regular English composi-
tion work. Arrangements have been
made by Judge Jacob Kanzler, director
of the campaign in Multnomah county,

According to the plans of the Roosevelt Memorial Association, the Roosevelt Memorial Fund of \$1,000,000 is to be utilized to erect a National Monument in Washington, D. C.; to acquire and maintain a public park at Oyster Bay, N. Y., and ultimately to include Sagamore Hill, the Roosevelt home, therein, to be preserved like Mount Vernon and Lincoln's home at Springfield; and to endow a National Society to perpetuate the principles and ideals of Theodore Roosevelt.

Each contributor to the fund will receive a certificate of membership in the Roosevelt Memorial Association. A certificate will also be presented to every school contributing to the fund.

The name of every contributor will be placed on the list of names deposited in the National Monument to be erected at Washington, D. C.

to send the five best essays to Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt at Oyster Bay, following publication of the essays in Portland newspapers.

Each teacher will select the best essay from pupils in her room, each principal will select the best essay from his school, and the Oregon state executive committee will select the best five essays submitted from all public schools in Port-

land, including high schools. Principals are urged to forward by mail or deliver the best essay from their schools to the Roosevelt Memorial headquarters, Press club rooms, Elks building, Broadway and Stark street, not later than October 22. No collections of money for the Roosevelt Memorial campaign will be made in the schools.

The aim of the committee in charge

of the campaign, which is to last until October 27, is to raise Portland's quota of \$21,000 through countless small subscriptions mingled with a few substantial offerings.

Ten Red Suspects Face Proceedings For Deportation

Gary, Ind., Oct. 15.—(U. P.)—Deportation warrants were sworn out today for 10 of the aliens arrested in raids by troops on Red centers here. The men were Russians and Austrians. All of these held, according to Colonel W. S. Maper, are aliens. Although Red and German flags and other symbols of revolutionary and alien governments were found in the raids, few evidences of Americanism were discovered.

Wildcat Whiskey Is Seized on Steamer

In a raid on the steamer Rose City Wednesday night, 30 half pint bottles of "wildcat" whiskey were confiscated by Officers Drake and Abbott. No arrests were made. Charged with selling hard cider, S. Hash, a Japanese merchant at 213 Alder street, was arrested Wednesday night by Officers Tangle and Tene, and Deputy Constable Jewell. John Carnegie was arrested at 30 North Third street by Officers Croder,

Powell and Schuplus, on a charge of violating the prohibition law. Manuel Carmona, arrested at the same time, was charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor.
