

STANFIELD CROPS MAKE PROSPERITY SECURE FOR YEAR

Everybody in District Shares in Benefits of Abundant Harvest Valued at Half Million.

BANNER SEASON FOR ALFALFA

First Time Orchards Yield in Commercial Quantities, and Fruit of Excellent Grade.

Stanfield, Oct. 18.—With the crops of this vicinity having a value of nearly half a million dollars, this community is experiencing an era of prosperity such as it has never known. Everybody has money and everybody is getting a share of the wealth which the soil is producing.

The big item this year will be alfalfa hay, as the farmers will receive about \$250,000 for their crop. On the Finnish project alone more than 10,000 tons of first-class hay has been produced, with a value of \$18 per ton in the stack, and from the tributary lands west of Stanfield at least 5000 tons will be placed on the market. Part of this crop has already been sold to feeders. With a strong demand for haled hay from outside points, hundreds of carloads of hay will be shipped from this community.

APPLES ARE EXPORTED
This is the first year that the orchards here have been producing in commercial quantities, and between 40 and 50 carloads of the finest quality apples will leave Stanfield. The Stanfield Fruit Growers' union and James M. Kyle are handling the product and have crews at work preparing the apples for export, as most of the crop will be sent across the water. The growers are receiving the top price, and the apples here will bring in at least \$100,000 to growers.

Peaches, pears and small fruits are grown in limited quantities, and while the shipments have not been large, the

fruit has all been first-class and has brought high prices. The value of these crops will probably be in the neighborhood of \$25,000.

CITY ENJOYS PROSPERITY
The city of Stanfield is in a prosperous condition, and the inhabitants have voted \$30,000 in bonds to install a modern water system. The bonds have been sold and the contract let for the material for this improvement. The work of installing the water mains will be done by the city, in order that the local people may be employed and part of the money kept at home.

The well has been drilled and a fine flow of water obtained. Contract for the erection of a 50,000 gallon tank has been let to the Pittsburg-Des Moines Steel company, and work on the erection of the tower will begin as soon as the material is received from the East. A large gas engine of the semi-Diesel type has been purchased. The new water system will cover the main part of town and will afford ample fire protection.

HENDERSHOTT SORRY COMRADES OF G. A. R. FIGHT PEACE LEAGUE

Convention at Columbus Was Like Drunken Mob, Says Delegate, in Debating Document.

That disapproval of the League of Nations by the G. A. R. at its recent convention in Columbus came only after scenes suggestive of a drunken mob and announcement from the chair that any dissolution of that topic was out of place, is charged by W. M. Hendershott, junior vice chancellor of the Oregon G. A. R., who has returned to Portland.

OPPOSITION FULLY AGREED
"I opposed discussion of that question as out of place. I cannot be accused of partisanship, as the secretary of the resolutions committee also opposed such a topic reaching the floor. He was sternly against the League of Nations. I am strongly in favor of it. The secretary's opposition was based upon his belief the league was a political question."

Hendershott said the action of the G. A. R. in openly expressing opposition to the League of Nations and President Wilson is a big mistake.

"From only one delegate to the convention did I hear praise of the present administration," Hendershott declared.

BOUGHT TO GAIN FLOOR
"This in face of the fact that no administration had been so liberal in the matter of pensions as the present one. Pensions have been raised from \$13 to \$20, and widows who formerly got \$12 now get \$25 a month. But the delegates present took the opportunity to show their ingratitude by denouncing the president and the League of Nations."

"I wanted to speak against the resolution but could not get the chance. I gave it up when I saw 20 or 30 other speakers trying to get the floor. It was like a drunken mob. These views of the league are my own. I am not a spokesman for the Grand Army in this matter. I was opposed to the resolution because I feel there is not a Hun in

Hunland who would not favor the resolution and oppose the League of Nations. And there is not a pro-German in America who would not favor the resolution and oppose the league. "I hated to see the Grand Army line itself up with that kind of cattle."

White Swan Wants Help From Oregon

Appealing to the State Chamber of Commerce for support, the White Swan Commercial club of White Swan, Wash., proposes that a connecting road link be made between the Inland Empire of Washington and the Columbia River highway, joining through White Salmon to Hood River. 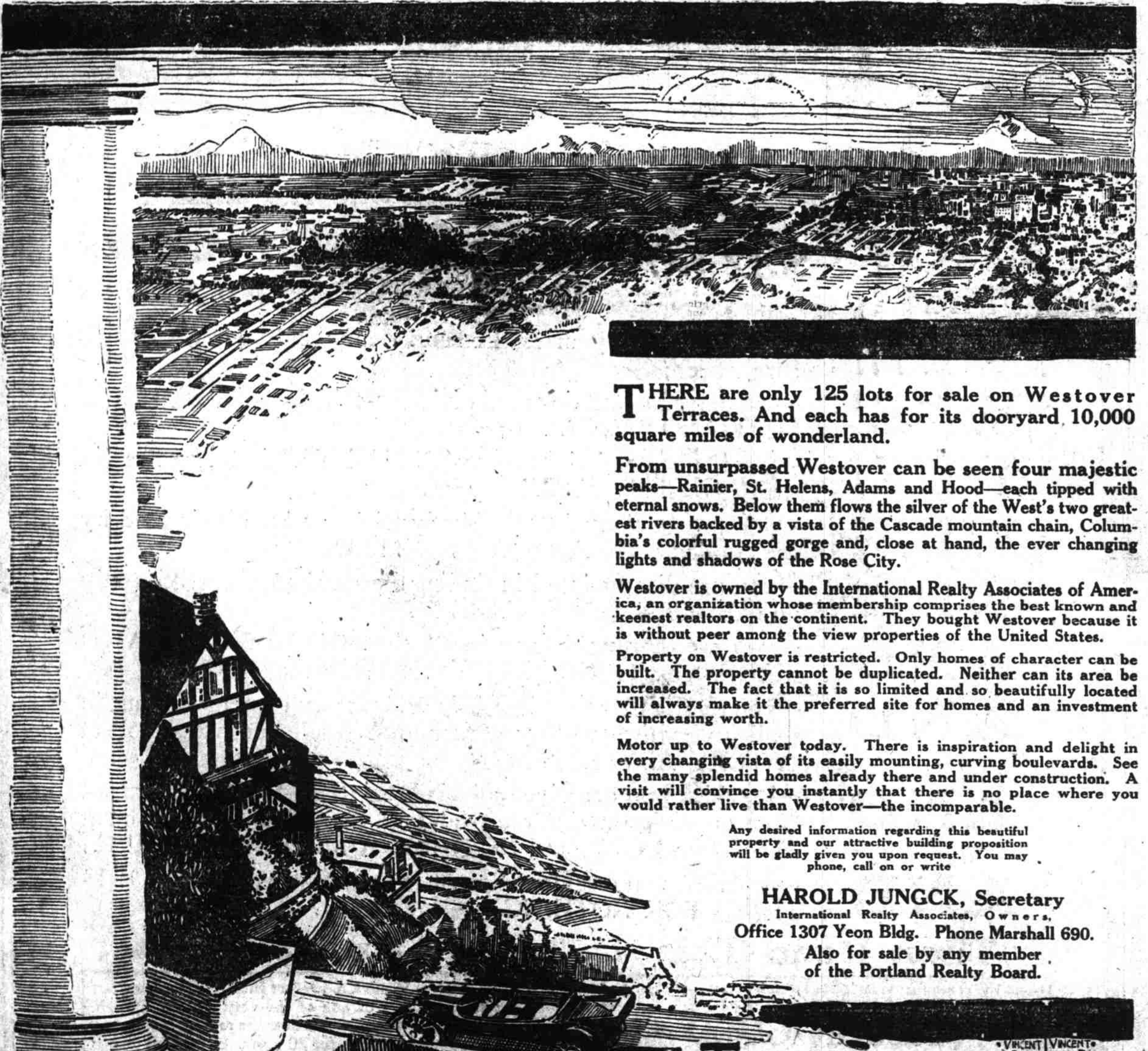
