

FLYING CHIEF TO DISCLOSE POLICE AERIAL SECRETS

Colonel Thompson to Give Portland City Officials Idea of Airplane Protection in East

ARRANGE GLIDDEN AIR DERBY

Head of New York City's Air Service Arrives Wednesday With Members of Commission.

Colonel Jefferson Demont Thompson, chief of New York City's air service, Wednesday will tell Mayor Baker and Chief of Police Nels Johnson about real "fly cops" when he arrives here with several other members of the arrangements commis-

sion of the Glidden world's air derby at 7 o'clock Wednesday evening.

Portland will be included in the Glidden derby route, according to a telegram received Monday by Bernard Metzger, president of the Aero club of Oregon. Metzger has invited the presidents of all Portland business organizations, as well as Mayor Baker and other city officials, to be present at the Chamber of Commerce Wednesday night.

The Glidden commission coming here will stay only four hours. Portland's inducements to make this city a stopping place will be told by the citizens' delegation.

Coming with the Glidden commission are Commodore Louis D. Beaumont, president; Major Charles J. Glidden, executive secretary; Ben Hillman, Aero Club of America; Alan R. Hawley, president Aero Club of America; Henry Woodhouse, vice president Aero Club of America; William Graves Sharp, former United States ambassador to France and member of Aero Club of America; Colonel Jefferson Demont Thompson, aerial police, New York city; Lieutenant Colonel S. Hearst, Sidney B. Valt, honorary secretary of the foreign service committee of the Aero Club of America in Paris; Harmon S. August, Aero Club of America; Captain Mark Oyenden, New York aerial police and special transcontinental representative of the commission.

Glidden's telegram to Metzger says the derby is held to create world-wide interest in aviation. The commission traveling in advance is selecting suitable landing fields and appointing officials in different cities to check arrival and departure of contestants.

AMERICANS ONLY FOR AMERICA, IS LEGION PLATFORM

Portland Post Demands Drastic Steps for Preservation of Ideals and Institutions of U. S.

ORGANIZATION POLICY GIVEN

Favors Universal Military Training, Standing Army, Reserve Corps and Rigid Naturalization Laws.

Drastic measures to keep America for Americans only were approved Monday night by Portland post of the American Legion. A questionnaire prepared by the organization's state executive committee recently called for expression

from local posts on certain policies. Opinions of the majority of state posts will be used to instruct delegates to the national convention of the American Legion in Minneapolis, November 11, 12 and 13.

Portland post favors the following policies, the vote Monday showed: Universal military training; not, however, to conflict with educational institutions.

Small standing army, a reserve corps and a strong national guard.

Strict naturalization laws and a restrictive immigration policy.

Immigrants to take out citizenship papers within certain time after arrival. Immediate relief for disabled service men.

English translation in adjacent column of all articles in foreign language newspapers.

Lump sum payments of war risk insurance instead of installments.

Vocational training for service men. Deportation of undesirable.

Complete investigation of army prison camps and punishment of those responsible for unjust treatment.

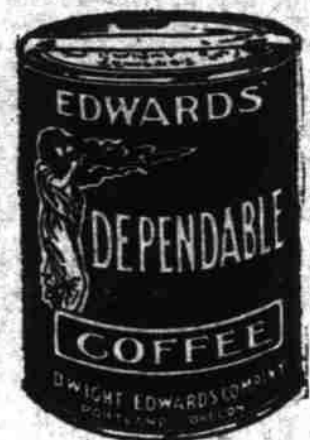
Opening of Klamath land to soldier settlement instead of long lease to corporations.
