

ADDITIONAL TWO MILL LEVY WOULD RESTORE BUREAU

If Tax Law Carries, Municipal Employment Office, Closed at Present, Would Be Resumed.

NECESSITY FOR IT PROVED

Place Was Means for Providing Steady Work for Many Women and Men Forced Into Idleness.

Promise of members of the city commission that if the 2 mill emergency tax measure is adopted at the special election next Wednesday, provision will be made for the immediate reopening of the federal employment bureau as a municipal service, has brought forth a great deal of support to the 2 mill measure, according to communications received at the city hall.

The employment bureau, which has operated for several years as a clearing house for men seeking work and employers seeking men, was closed November 1 because federal funds were exhausted and no new appropriations were made. An effort was made at that time to have the city take over the work, but investigation revealed the fact that the city was without money to finance the agency. Accordingly the council agreed to make the reestablishment of the bureau contingent on the city getting additional funds.

BUREAU IS BIG ASSET

The employment bureau has been a big asset in the labor world because the institution had gained the confidence of both employer and employee. Men were furnished work through this bureau in every part of the Northwest. The bureau had a big part in cutting some of the private agencies whose activities were of such nature that they came into disrepute. Also it played a big part in placing returned soldiers on jobs of various kinds.

An indication of the amount of work handled is shown for the month of June, which was an average month. The bureau placed 538 men during that month at no cost to the men and at no cost to the employer. By official sanction the bureau was able to prevent unscrupulous employers from taking unfair advantage of men and putting them out in quest of jobs when the jobs were not there.

WOMEN'S BUREAU HELPFUL

In addition to a bureau for men there was a bureau for women, which also closed pending the outcome of the election. It will be reestablished along with the men's bureau if the city is able to finance the move. This bureau had been a wonderful asset to working women, and provided thousands with employment. During the month of June the total number placed was 3073 at no cost to either the person employed or the employer.
