

STEAMER MUST SECURE CARGO OR SAIL EMPTY

Time Limit Placed on New Steel Vessel J. R. Gordon, and Cargo Limitations Are Factors.

LUMBER NOT ACCEPTABLE

Flour Rate Not Attractive; Mixed Cargo Desired; Chamber Endeavoring to Supply 8000 Tons

If orders for 8000 tons of cargo for New York delivery are not received by local managers by next Tuesday, the newly completed steamer J. R. Gordon, built by the Northwest Steel company for the Union Sulphur company, will proceed from this port to the Atlantic in ballast.

That was the statement today of W. Patterson, president of the Northwest Bond & Investment company, who has been commissioned by Douglas Woodhams & Co., eastern agents, to secure a cargo for the steamer. Not half of the required amount of cargo has yet been scheduled, due to the limitations placed by the owners on the nature of the shipments to be made.

The matter of setting cargo for this steamer was referred to the Chamber of Commerce by Patterson and officers of the chamber are hopeful of landing the required amount of business before the time limit expires. However, the chamber is making an effort to induce the eastern agents to accept a cargo partially composed of flour.

The chamber is working to secure a mixed cargo of general merchandise and offerings of cheese, apples, box hoot, wood, hops, canned goods, paper and other Oregon products are suggested.

NEW WAVE LENGTH ADOPTED
