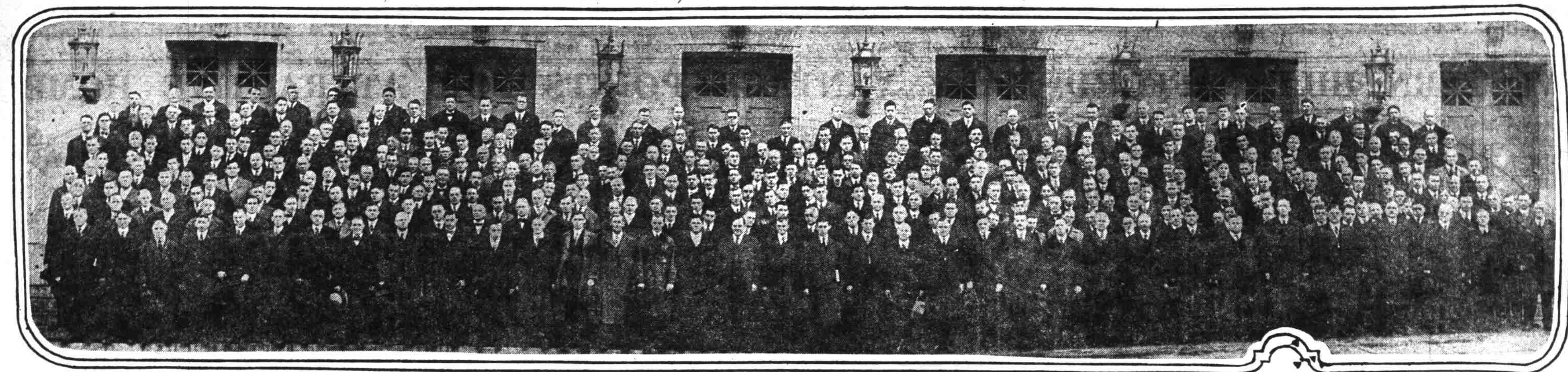


# GREAT CLASS OF MASONS TAKES SCOTTISH RITE DEGREE
