chendler, ghouls who are sucking the last drops of the life blood of Austria and responsible for at least half of the existing misery, by reason of their speculation, which keep the prices of necessities of life beyond the reach of any except the very rich. They eat the best, not counting the cost. CRY FOR BREAD "Give us bread" rings through Aus-

tria, but bread is not to be had. The cafes are filled with patrons eating pastries made from chestnut flour. The greatest suffering is among the middle and lower classes, those who on miserable pittances have to keep up appearances and therefore must often go without food. 
